Reflection

In our homes, we live with boundaries — private spaces like bedrooms or home offices, and rules like curfews or respectful speech. These boundaries help create order and protect one another.

But sometimes we set boundaries for the wrong reasons — to exclude or punish, like refusing to speak to a sibling when we're upset. These kinds of barriers can hurt more than help.

In Jesus' time, social boundaries excluded certain groups. Last week's Gospel reminded us of the Samaritans. This Sunday, in **Luke 10:38–42**, we see another example: women. While Martha follows expected roles, Mary crosses a boundary by sitting at Jesus' feet as a disciple — and Jesus welcomes her.

As a family, read this Gospel together and reflect: Are there boundaries we keep that separate rather than unite? How can we break down those walls?

When we pray the **Lord's Prayer**, we call God "Our Father" — a reminder that we are all His children, and no one should be left out. Close your reflection by praying the Lord's Prayer together.

First Reading Book of Genesis 18:1-10

Lord, do not bypass your servant.

The Lord appeared to Abraham at the Oak of Mamre while he was sitting by the entrance of the tent during the hottest part of the day. He looked up, and there he saw three men standing near him. As soon as he saw them he ran from the entrance of the tent to meet them, and bowed to the ground. 'My Lord,' he said 'I beg you, if I find favour with you, kindly do not pass your servant by.
