Reflection



Coronavirus Restrictions

50 people can be in the church for services and we need to register for Mass. This can be done by:

- 1. Writing your name and contact details in either the red or blue Mass Register kept at the entrance to the church
- 2. Ringing the parish office on 83791740 in office hours
- 3. Emailing a request to warnervaleparish@bbcatholic.org.au
- 4. Arriving early for Mass and writing your name on the list for this Mass, if there are any spaces available

From 1 July there can be one person in the church for every four square metres. This means we can have 138 people in our church. We will not need to register in advance, but will need to leave our name and contact details, keep physical distancing and hygiene requirements. More details about this next week.

It is recommended that you do not come to the church if you are feeling unwell and everyone is encouraged to download the COVID-19 app.

He has delivered the soul of the needy from the hands of those who are evil.

Responsorial Psalm Ps 68:8-10, 14, 17, 33-35

R. Lord, in your great love, answer me

It is for you that I suffer taunts,

that shame covers my face, that I have become a stranger to my brothers, an alien to my own mother's sons.

I burn with zeal for your house and taunts against you fall on me. R

This is my prayer to you, my prayer for your favour. In your great love, answer me, O God, with your help that never fails: Lord, answer, for your love is kind; in your compassion, turn towards me.

Second Reading

Romans 5:12-13

God's gift to us is nothing like our sin against him.

Sin entered the world through one man, and through sin death, and thus death has spread through the whole human race because everyone has sinned. Sine existed in the world long before the Law was given. There was no law and so no one could be accused of the sin of 'law-breaking', yet death reigned over all from Adam to Moses, even though their sin, unlike that of Adam, was not a matter of breaking the law.

Adam prefigured the One to come, but the gift itself considerably outweighed the fall. If it is certain that through one man's fall so many died, it is even more certain that divine grace, coming through the one man, Jesus Christ, came to so many as an abundant free gift.

Gospel Matthew 10:26-33

Do not fear those who can kill the body.

Jesus instructed the Twelve as follows: 'Do not be afraid. For everything that is now covered will be uncovered, and everything now hidden will be made clear. What I say to you in the dark, tell in the daylight; what you hear in whispers, proclaim from the house-tops.

'Do not be afraid of those who kill the body but cannot kill the soul; fear him rather who can destroy both body and soul in hell. Can you not buy two sparrows for a penny? And yet not one falls to the ground without your Father knowing. Why, every hair on your head has been counted. So there is no need to be afraid; you are worth more than hundreds of sparrows.

'So if anyone declares himself for me in the presence of men, I will declare myself for him in the presence of my Father in heaven. But the one who disowns me in the presence of men, I will disown in the presence of my Father in heaven.'
