Response to Coronavirus

The Diocese has issued instructions to the parishes of Broken Bay in a letter from Bishop Anthony which is on the website and on our notice board. It is summarised as follows:

All public Masses have been suspended until further notice. This includes a dispensation from the obligation for us to attend Mass on Sunday.

Baptisms may continue but families are advised to limit participants to immediate family and godparents. Only children from one family are to be baptised at each ceremony. Please contact parish office for more details and to confirm baptism times.

The Confirmation program is suspended and will be rescheduled.

Funerals and Weddings may continue but the number in the church must not exceed 100 people.

Reconciliation be celebrated may individually - in the first rite only.

Anointing of the Sick may be celebrated individually with anointing to be on the forehead only.

Arrangements for Holy Week and Easter liturgies are being considered.

We are **encouraged to pray**, especially the rosary and the church will remain **open** for prayer and personal devotion.

We are certainly living in unusual times! Who would have thought we would ever be cancelling Sunday Masses?

How can we understand this? We are being asked to let go of something that is important to us – our liturgical assembly – for the good of others, especially the most vulnerable in our society. We are the Body of Christ and when one part of the body is in need, the other parts must attend to it (1 Cor 12:26). This self-sacrificing love is what the Eucharist is truly about.

Although we are not gathering as a community for Mass, we can still pray. The church will be open for private prayer at the times we would normally have had Mass. Most importantly, we can pray at home and use this as a time to grow our personal prayer life and our relationship with Jesus. At the back of the bulletin is a resource with links to the daily readings, Mass online and ideas about making a spiritual communion.

Social Justice and COVID-19 What can we do about the Corona virus?

First of all we must all comply with the expert advice on how to avoid infection. Then we realise all the consequential social, legal, and financial complications - bankruptcy, unemployment, even more poverty and homelessness, and the social unrest as a result of the deprivation to be suffered by many in our community.

Many will suffer loss, including self-funded retirees, and it is ironic that those of us on fixed incomes, like aged pensioners, who avoid infection will be very fortunate indeed, for we will be able to continue to maintain our standard of living.

Many of us can't afford to give money; we can't risk visitations or providing personal services to those affected; but we do have a telephone; we do have our email and we have Facebook to maintain contact with those in isolation - we could offer to do small errands for neighbours, collect and deliver medicines and groceries, etc.

We can converse, offer encouragement, and friendship. We may be able to direct them to people who can answer their concerns about health, finance, etc.

We can pray for them, with them, and offer spiritual encouragement. We can drop the Parish Bulletin in their letter box and otherwise keep them abreast of what is happening in the Parish and we should pray to God in thanks for the blessings we have.

Online Mass and other resources

During these unprecedented times, quite painfully, many Catholics will be unable to attend Mass. No doubt, this will only increase our hunger for Christ. We encourage you to continue your life of prayer and participation in the life of the Church despite this heavy cross. This page seeks to provide guidance to Catholics regarding their participation in Mass during the Coronavirus pandemic.

What is a Dispensation from Mass?

A dispensation from a diocesan bishop releases Catholics from fulfilling their Sunday obligation of attending Mass. On 18 March 2020 Bishop Anthony announced the suspension of public liturgies and celebrations of Mass, until further notice, for the health and safety of the community. In light of this, he also announced that all Catholics in the Diocese of Broken Bay are dispensed from their Sunday obligation until further notice (canon 1248).

What should I do if I can't go to Mass?

Since you are unable to be present at a celebration of the Eucharist, we encourage you to participate in other ways such as spending time in personal and family prayer, reflecting on and praying with the Scriptures (particularly the Mass readings), making a Stations of the Cross, praying the Rosary, making a spiritual communion (see below) and participating in Mass online (see more below). Further information about opportunities for Sacrament of Reconciliation, Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament and times of private prayer will follow. The church will remain open at the times when we would normally celebrate Mass.

What is a spiritual communion and how do I make one?

Catholics have long been encouraged to partake in the practice of making a "spiritual communion" if they are unable to receive the Eucharist for a particular reason (for instance – being homebound). Simply put, it is coming before God in prayer – expressing our deep desire to be united to Him despite the fact that we are unable to be united to Him in receiving the Eucharist.

This spiritual communion can be made in various ways. One common way of doing so involves spending a dedicated time of prayer and reflection on the Mass readings. The daily Mass readings can be viewed at https://melbournecatholic.org.au/daily-readings

Another popular way is by reciting the prayer written by St. Alphonsus Liguori:

An Act of Spiritual Communion

My Jesus, I believe that You are present in the Most Holy Sacrament. I love You above all things, and I desire to receive You into my soul. Since I cannot at this moment receive You sacramentally, come at least spiritually into my heart. I embrace You as if You were already there and unite myself wholly to You. Never permit me to be separated from You.

Amen

How can I participate in Mass online?

Despite our current limitations, we can still participate in the celebration of Mass online thanks to modern technology. Many dioceses around the world provide online streaming of Masses. Below are some links to online Masses. We also encourage you to think about how you might help those homebound and less tech-savvy to be able to access Mass online during this time.

1. St Patrick's Cathedral, Melbourne

Mass at St Patrick's Cathedral, Melbourne is available daily. The 1pm Mass is streamed live daily (Mon-Fri) and is then available as a recording on-demand until one hour prior to the next Mass. Sunday Mass is available, with the 11am Mass live streamed and it is also available as a recording on-demand.

2. Pope Francis' daily Mass

3. Mass for You at Home
