Reflection

The event of Pentecost marks the beginning of the time of the Church. We, as the Church, proclaim Christ's message in every language and witness to the presence of the spirit by manifesting the Spirit's gifts especially the gift of love.

It is good to reflect on the Spirit's presence in our own lives. Through the grace of our Baptism and sealed more completely at our Confirmation, we too are commissioned to carry out this same evangelistic mission as Christ's Disciples with the confidence that the Holy Spirit will truly guide and strengthen us for the journey. The great Franciscan Theologian and Doctor of the Church, St. Bonaventure, says that *"The Holy Spirit comes where He is loved, where He is invited, where He is expected."* Though God has given us this great gift through the Sacraments, He does not force us to use it, rather He waits patiently for us to invite Him into any situation, big or small, and rushes in with great excitement at the mere appeal, *"come Holy Spirit."*

By our very Baptism we are called to proclaim "Christ is Lord." The celebration of the solemnity of Pentecost is a reminder for everyone of us to participate in this mission. More on Coercive Control

Used by a person to dominate and control their partner or family member and can involve surveillance, insults, withholding money and physical violence or threats. "People that feel intimidated, controlled, overpowered, frightened, scared, feel like they're a hostage in their own home," explained Delia Donovan, CEO of Domestic Violence NSW.

Introduced to the NSW parliament by Labor MP Anna Watson, a private member's bill to make coercive control and offence under the Crimes Act. It's named "Preethi's Law" in honour of [32-year-old dentist Preethi Reddy, who was killed by her ex-boyfriend in March 2019.](#)

More needs to be done to resource the domestic violence sector and any reform involves thorough consultations with victim-survivors and advocates.

Please pray for all working to fix the Domestic Violence issue and help by writing/emailing our local MPs regarding the need to resource this sector before more lives are lost.

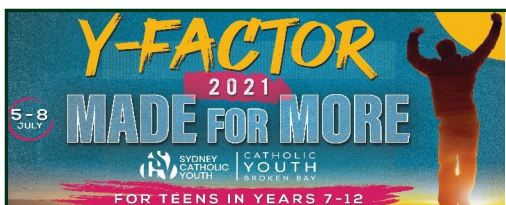
First Holy Communion
