On Palm Sunday we remember Jesus' entry into Jerusalem on a donkey. Large crowds laying palm branches on the road before Jesus and proclaiming him as king. Here is a man with Charisma, with a stirring message! The contrast between the Prince of Peace and the powers and dominions of his day could not be starker. Also known as Passion Sunday the day highlights the paradox of Christ's kingship. Our palms represent his victory; but a victory that only comes through suffering and self sacrifice.

#### Good Friday—Way of the Cross



**On Good Friday (29th March) at 10am** we will be walking the Way of the Cross with stations of the cross around the outside of the Church (weather permitting). We are

#### Catechist Letter to Parishioners

Dear Parishioners,

We are looking for people who would like to train as Catechists. You would start as an assistant. Full training and all material resources are provided. Below are what our Catechists are teaching the children:

Lorette Kelty (both Warnervale & Woongarrah PS - Early Stage 1 (Kindergarten) explore the themes of Lent and Easter and how. during Lent we give up some of our favourite things and try harder to be kind and good. Symbols of Easter, such as the bunny and the egg, represent New Life.

Michael Tebbutt & Amelia Wyn Warnervale PS: Kerrie Dedera & Rocio Romero Woongarrah PS -Stage 1A (Year 1 & 2) how Jesus encourages us to grow and change during Lent. They will also learn about the Last Supper and how it relates to the families and the parish community's celebration of the Eucharist.

Stage 2A Woongarrah PS Kerrie Dedera & Jason Vassallo (Year 3 & 4) how Jesus continually reached out to help others through his healing and works of forgiveness and that we are asked to do the same through the Lenten practice of prayer, fasting and works of charity. They will recall the events of Holy Thursday and Good Friday. Also at Warnervale PS Kerrie Dedera & Christine Sassine Year 4 and Year 3 Jason Vassallo.

Paul Kelly & Nadine De Villa Warnervale PS and Maureen Mulheron Woongarrah PS Stage 3A (Year 5 & 6) will further develop their understanding of Lenten practices and be encouraged to apply them to their daily lives. Through the Stations of the Cross, students will study key Gospel accounts of incidents during Jesus' passion and death. They will also reflect on the hope that Jesus' resurrection offers all believers.

## 1st Gospel Mark 11:1-10

## Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord.

When they drew near to Jerusalem, to Bethphage and Bethany at the Mount of Olives, Jesus sent two of his disciples, and said to them, 'Go into the village opposite you, and immediately as you enter it you will find a colt tied, on which no one has ever sat; untie it and bring it. If anyone says to you, 'Why are you doing this?" say, "The Lord has need of it and will send it back here immediately". And they went away, and found a colt tied at the door out in the open street; and they untied it. And those who stood there said to them, 'What are you doing, untying the colt?' And they told them what Jesus had said; and they let them go. And they brought the colt to Jesus and threw their garments on it; and he sat upon it. And many spread their garments on the road, and others spread leavy branches which they had cut from the fields. And those who went before and those who followed cried out, 'Hosana!
