Resumption of Mass from 19th October 2021

The Most Reverend Anthony Randazzo Bishop of Broken Bay sent a letter during the week revoking his decree suspending the celebration of public masses from 19th October. In his letter he has also continued to suspend the Sunday Obligation until 1 December in order to assure our people of our respect for the personal choices they may need to make during this initial period of emergence from lockdown.

Mass times will resume pre-covid (mass times are located on the bulletin).

In resuming Masses, it is important that all Covid safety requirements are adhere to.

- The church capacity 138 people in the church at any one time for a service, this is in line with the 1 person per 4 square metres rule.
- Physical distancing of 1.5 metres between people of different households is required. Spread out through-out the whole church. Only sit on every 2nd pew, please sit in the middle. Keep a safe distance when in communion line, entering and leaving the church.
- Please ensure you use hand sanitizer on entering and leaving the Church.

An Indigenous Response

In the current Social Justice Statement, Cry of the Earth, Cry of the Poor, we have a short statement from the late Deacon Boniface Perdjert who was an indigenous man of deep spirituality and a tireless worker for the Church in Wadeye country (Port Keats). He was ordained as Australia's first permanent deacon in 1974 by Bishop O'Loughlin, the Bishop of Darwin. He died in the year 2019.

Although he did not live to see the publication of this statement, the Bishops have included in it a reflection of his on our land. He said:

"We like the way [Jesus] uses the things of nature to teach, and the important part nature plays in the Sacraments. We can appreciate also the community nature of the Church, because we are very conscious of being part of a group, bound by Religious ties. We are strong on ceremony through dance and song and painted bodies. Our ceremony closely involves groups and group participation...So the ceremony of the Mass, the ceremony of the Sacraments, and the ceremony of the liturgy should find a ready response in us, provided it is made meaningful, based on a theology that is tuned to the Aboriginal mind".
