Dear Parishioners of Saint Mary of the Cross MacKillop Parish



Catechists participate in the ministry bringing the message of God's kingdom to Catholic students who attend public schools. Catechists provide Catholic Special Religious Education, also know as Scripture, to children attending Warnervale Public School and Woongarrah Public School in 30-minute weekly lessons.

Our Parish currently has 4 Catechists and 3 Assistants. We are also blessed to have the help of Brother Shayne and our Regional CCD Director, without whose help we would be short teachers for a Year 5 class, a combined Year 1 & 2 class and a combined Year 3 and 4 class.

For the 2024 school year it's estimated that we will be short 3 teachers and assistants to help them.

There are around 200 Catholic children who receive SRE from our Parish Catechists.

We have other schools in our Parish where the children are unable to receive their religious education due to our low numbers. From next term at Warnervale School due to the large number of Catholic children in the class the year 3 and year 4 students will be receiving fortnightly lessons.

The programme we use, is *Walking With Jesus*, has been approved by Bishop Anthony Randazzo. Our Teacher's Manuals contain easy to follow lesson plans with specially designed PowerPoints to support each lesson.

The necessary training to obtain full authorisation to teach the *Walking With Jesus* programme is provided ed free of charge. This training is provided via Zoom which means you can complete it at home. If you are unable to manage Zoom don't worry we are here to help.

The Catechists in our Parish undertake a vital evangelising role, educating children and forming them in the Catholic faith.

If you have ever thought about becoming a Catechist or an assistant, now is a good time to respond so as to be ready to start as a helper in a class for next year.

Matthew 20:1-16

Why are you jealous because I am generous?

Jesus said to his disciples: 'The kingdom of heaven is like a landowner going out at daybreak to hire workers for his vineyard. He made an agreement with the workers for one denarius a day, and sent them to his vineyard. Going out at about the third hour he saw others standing idle in the market place and said to them, "You go to my vineyard too and I will give you a fair wage." So they went. At about the sixth hour and again at about the ninth hour, he went out and did the same. Then at about the eleventh hour he went out and found more men standing round, and he said to them, "Why have you been standing here idle all day?" "Because no one has hired us" they answered. He said to them, "You go into my vineyard too." In the evening, the owner of the vineyard said to his bailiff, "Call the workers and pay them their wages, starting with the last arrivals and ending with the first." So those who were hired at about the eleventh hour came forward and received one denarius each. When the first came, they expected to get more, but they too received one denarius each. They took it, but grumbled at the landowner. "The men who came last" they said "have done only one hour, and you have treated them the same as us, though we have done a heavy day's work in all the heat." He answered one of them and said, "My friend, I am not being unjust to you; did we not agree on one denarius? Take your earnings and go. I choose to pay the last comer as much as I pay you. Have I no right to do what I like with my own? Why be envious because I am generous?" Thus the last will be first, and the first, last.' The Gospel of the Lord.
