Christmas Lunch a Meal to Remember

Christmas is here.

Whatever the rush, the tension, the money worries and work hassles, Christmas is here and there's only one thing to do: **MAKE THE MOST OF IT!**

The setting. A few visual effects can create an atmosphere of family belonging. A wall collage of family photos is a talking point as people peruse it before lunch and say 'Remember when....' some families make a 'fridge list of all the positive family happenings throughout the year which people add to throughout the day. Tell stories. Keep alive your family identity and traditions with stories -true or tallabout your ancestors. Pray together. A simple prayer of thanksgiving before everyone hoes into lunch brings life into clear focus. Celebrate new life. A newborn baby or a new child has a special way of drawing people out of themselves and softening hearts. Let go of grudges and petty resentments. Allow the peace of Christ to reign in your home today. Acknowledge sadness. Personal losses and disappointments are felt most keenly at Christmas time. Don't' be afraid to connect with grieving family member with a quiet word or gesture of support. Pitch in and help. Don't allow one or two people to be burdened with all the cooking, serving, cleaning. And be flexible. Allow people to help even if it's not quiet the way you would do it. Welcome visitors. Is there room at your inn? An hospitable home both gives and receives the presence of Christ. After lunch (or before): Appoint your family's best sportsperson or socialite to organise everybody into a game of cricket, balderdash or trivial pursuit (your own family questions of course). Then again, some families enjoy a sing-a-long 'round the piano-all the old hits. Mention Christ during the day. Yes of course Christmas is about Jesus, but sometimes its good to state the obviousthrough word or symbol. Place a nativity crib in a prominent place.

Read the Christmas story at grace. Get the children singing Happy Birthday to Jesus.

First Reading Isaiah 52:7-10

The Nativity of the Lord

Second Reading Hebrews 1:1-6

In our own time, God speaks to us through his Son.

At various times in the past and in various different ways, God spoke to our ancestors through the prophets; but in our own time, the last days, he has spoken to us through his Son, the Son that he has appointed to inherit everything and through whom he made everything there is. He is the radiant light of God's glory and the perfect copy of his nature, sustaining the universe by his powerful command; and now that he has destroyed the defilement of sin, he has gone to take his place in heaven at the right hand of divine Majesty. So he is now as far above the angels as the title which he has inherited is higher than his own name.

God has never said to any angel: You are my Son, today I have become your father, or: I will be a father to him and he a son tom e. Again, when he brings the First-born into the world, he says: Let all the angels of God worship him.

The Nativity of the Lord

Gospel John 1:1-18

The Word of God became flesh and dwelt among us, and we saw his glory.

In the beginning was the Word:

The Word was with God and the Word was God.

He was with God in the beginning. Through him all things came to be, not one thing had its being but through him. All that came to be had life in him and that life was the light of men, a light that shines in the dark, a light that darkness could not overpower.

A man came, sent by God. His name was John. He came as a witness, as a witness to speak for the light, so that everyone might believe through him. He was not the light only a witness to speak for the light.

The Word was the true light that enlightens all men; and he was coming into the world. He was in the world that had its being through him, and the world did not know him. He came to his own domain and his own people did not accept him. But to all who did accept him he gave power to become children of God, to all who believe in the name of him who was born not out of human stock or urge of the flesh or will of man but of God himself.

The Word of man flesh, he lived among us, and we saw his glory, the glory that is his as the only Son of the Father, full of grace and truth.

John appears as his witness. He proclaims:

'This is the one of whom I said:

He who comes after me ranks before me because he existed before me.'

Indeed, from his fullness we have, all of us, received—yes grace in return for grace, since, though the Law was given through Moses, grace and truth have come through Jesus Christ.

No one has ever seen God; it is the only Son, who is nearest to the Father's heart, who has made him known.
