No Assisted Dying Legislation

Our State Parliament is likely to pass a Bill to facilitate assisted dying for patients who are terminally ill, Archbishop Anthony Fisher has reminded us that any action intended to terminate lives whilst they may be done with the best of intentions they are intrinsically evil. He said, the Catholic Church has long operated to uphold the dignity of the elderly and dying and compassionately to relieve their suffering, never entertaining killing them or collaborating in bringing about their early death.

Any laws sanctioning such actions should be opposed. Our Catholic health and aged care providers must be given their space to operate in different ways.

Secondly, the sanctity of life principle and consequent prohibition on killing has been a cornerstone of our law and medical practice and should not be abandoned lightly. This view is not monopolised by Christians but is shared by international human rights instruments, the pre-Christian Hippocratic Oath, and the ethics of medical associations.

We must not sugarcoat the truth.

Gospel

John 6:1-15

He distributed to those who were seated as much as they wanted.

Jesus went off to the other side of the Sea of Galilee—or of Tiberias—and a large crowd followed him, impressed by the signs he gave by curing the sick. Jesus climbed the hillside, and sat down there with his disciples. It was shortly before the Jewish feast of Passover.

Looking up, Jesus saw the crowds approaching and said to Philip, 'Where can we buy some bread for these people to eat?' He only said this to test Philip; he himself knew exactly what he was going to do. Philip answered, 'Two hundred denarii would only buy enough to give them a small piece each.' One of his disciples, Andrew, Simon Peter's brother said, 'There is a small boy here with five barley loaves and two fish; but what is that between so many?' Jesus said to them, 'Make the people sit down.' There was plenty of grass there, and as many as five thousand men sat down. Then Jesus took the loaves, gave thanks, and gave them out to all who were sitting ready; he then did the same with the fish, giving out as much as he wanted. When they had eaten enough he said to the disciples, 'Pick up the pieces left over, so that nothing gets wasted.' So they picked them up, and filled twelve hampers with scraps left over from the meal of five barley loaves. The people, seeing this sign that he had given, 'said, 'This really is the prophet who is to come into the world.' Jesus, who could see they were about to come and take him by force and make him king, escaped back to the hills by himself.
