Reflection

Today's readings focus on the kind of prayer that reaches God's heart.

In the First Reading (Sirach 35:12–19), we are reminded that **God listens not to status or power, but to sincerity and need**. The Lord hears the cry of the poor and the prayer of the humble — those who pour out their hearts before Him.

In the Gospel (Luke 18:9–14), Jesus contrasts the proud Pharisee and the humble tax collector. The Pharisee boasts of his virtue, while the tax collector simply prays, "God, be merciful to me, a sinner." Jesus teaches that **true prayer comes from humility, not self-righteousness**.

God's mercy lifts the lowly and welcomes all who come before Him with honesty and trust. It is not perfection, but humility and sincerity, that open the way to God's grace.

Second Reading Letter of St Paul to Timothy 4:6-8, 16-18

All that remains is the crown of righteousness reserved for me.

My life is already being poured away as a libation, and the time has come for me to be gone. I have fought the good fight to the end; I have run the race to the finish; I have kept the faith; all there is to come now is the crown of righteousness reserved for me, which the Lord, the righteous judge, will give to me on that Day; and not only to me but to all those who have longed for his Appearing.

The first time I had to present my defence, there was not a single witness to support me. Every one of them deserted me - may they not be held accountable for it. But the Lord stood by me and gave me power, so that through me the whole message might be proclaimed for all the pagans to hear; and so I was rescued from the lion's mouth. The Lord will rescue me from all evil attempts on me, and bring me safely to his heavenly kingdom. To him be glory for ever and ever. Amen.

The publican returned to his home justified; the Pharisee did not.

Jesus spoke the following parable to some people who prided themselves on being virtuous and despised everyone else. 'Two men went up to the Temple to pray, one a Pharisee, the other a tax collector. The Pharisee stood there and said this prayer to himself, "I thank you, God, that I am not grasping, unjust, adulterous like the rest of mankind, and particularly that I am not like this tax collector here. I fast twice a week; I pay tithes on all I get." The tax collector stood some distance away, not daring even to raise his eyes to heaven; but he beat his breast and said, "God, be merciful to me, a sinner." This man, I tell you, went home again at rights with God; the other did not. For everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, but the man who humbles himself will be exalted.'
