Readings: Acts 9:26-31; 1 Jn 3:18-24; Jn 15:1-8

Response:

I will praise you, Lord, in the assembly of your people.

Reflection

First Reading (Acts 9:26-31): Reflect on Saul's transformation and reception by the early Christian community in Jerusalem as recounted in Acts 9:26-31. Despite initial distrust due to his past, Saul boldly proclaims Jesus after his encounter on the road to Damascus, contributing to the Gospel's spread.

Second Reading (1 John 3:18-24): where John stresses the significance of love in Christian living. He encourages believers to show love through actions, particularly by aiding those in need. Through loving one another, believers remain in God and find assurance in answered prayers.

Gospel (John 15:1-8): Jesus uses the metaphor of the vine and branches to illustrate the intimate relationship between himself and his disciples. He declares, "I am the vine, you are the branches. Whoever remains in me and I in him will bear much fruit because without me you can do nothing." This passage emphasizes the importance of remaining connected to Jesus, the source of life and nourishment, in order to bear fruit in the Kingdom of God.

Overall, these readings invite reflection on the themes of conversion, community, love, and spiritual growth. They challenge believers to deepen their relationship with Christ, to live lives of love and service, and to remain rooted in him as branches on the vine.

Fifth Sunday of Easter, Year B

First Reading Acts of the Apostles 9:26-31

He explained how the Lord appeared to Saul and spoke to him on his journey.

When Saul got to Jerusalem he tried to join the disciples, but they were all afraid of him: they could not believe he was really a disciple. Barnabas, however, took charge of him, introduced him to the apostles, and explained how the Lord had appeared to Saul and spoke to him on his journey, and how he had preached boldly at Damascus in the name of Jesus. Saul now started to go round with them in Jerusalem, preaching fearlessly in the name of the Lord. But after he had spoken to the Hellenists, and argued with them, they became determined to kill him. When the brothers knew, they took him to Caesarea, and sent him off from there to tarsus.

The churches throughout Judaea, Galilee and Samaria were now left in peace, building themselves up, living in the fear of the Lord, and filled with the consolation of the Holy Spirit.

Second Reading First Letter of St John 3:18-24

His commandments are these: that we believe and that we love one another.

My children,

our love is not to be just words or mere talk, but something real and active; only by this can we be certain that we are the children of the truth and be able to quieten our conscience in his presence, whatever accusations it may raise against us, because God is greater than our conscience and he knows everything. My dear people,

if we cannot be condemned by our conscience, we need not be afraid in God's presence, and whatever we ask him, we shall receive, because we keep his commandments and live the kind of life that he wants. His commandments are these: that we believe in the name of his Son Jesus Christ and that we love one another as he told us to.

Whoever keeps his commandments lives in God and God lives in him. We know that he lives in us by the Spirit that he has given us.

Gospel Acclamation Alleluia, alleluia!

Live in me and let me live in you, says the Lord; my branches bear much fruit. Alleluia, alleluia!

Gospel John 15:1-8

All who live in me, and I in them, bear much fruit.

Jesus said to his disciples:

'I am the true vine, and my Father is the vinedresser. Every branch in me that bears no fruit he cuts away, and every branch that does bear fruit he prunes to make it bear even more. You are pruned already, by means of the word that I have spoken to you. Make your home in me, and I make mine in you. As a branch cannot bear fruit all by itself, but must remain part of the vine, neither can you unless you remain in me. I am the vine, you are the branches. Whoever remains in me, with me in him, bears fruit in plenty; for cut off from me you can do nothing. Anyone who does not remain in me is like a branch that has been thrown away—he withers; these branches are collected and thrown on the fire, and they are burnt. If you remain in me and my words remain in you, you may ask what you will and you shall get it. It is to the glory of my Father that you should bear much fruit, and then you will be my disciples.'
