Social Justice Sunday 29/8

The Australian Catholic Bishops Conferences' Social Justice Statement 2021 -22: Cry of the Earth, Cry of the Poor, affirms that "we human beings need a change of heart, mind, and behaviour".

Listening to our communities – the Bishops go on to say, "The way in which we have built our cities has also resulted in urban heat islands. In places like western Sydney, it is becoming more difficult for children to play outdoors because it is just too hot, and are learning less - in classrooms without air conditioning.

January 4 2020, Penrith was the hottest place on Earth at 48.9 C and in 2019 Parramatta sweltered through 47 days with temperatures over 35 degrees C.

For First Nations people, the ecological crisis is particularly painful. One spokesperson for First Nations peoples has expressed her deep sadness at the loss of a grandmother tree as a result of ongoing drought and persistent flames from bushfires.

We also hear a cry of the young. They see their future being threatened, and want change, as a matter of intergenerational justice. One student sums up the feelings of his generation:

I reckon (the community) should listen to us because at the end of the day it's our future, right? They're going to be going and it's going to be up to us to continue.".

Deuteronomy 4:1-2, 6-8

You may add nothing to the word which I speak to you—keep the commands of the Lord.

Moses said to the people: 'Now, Israel, take notice of the laws and customs that I teach you to-day, and observe them, that you may have life and may enter and take possession of the land that the Lord the God of your fathers is giving you. You must add nothing to what I command you, and take nothing from it, but keep the commandments of the Lord your God just as I lay them down for you. Be doers of the word

It is all that is good, everything that is perfect, which is given us from above; it comes down from the Father of all light; with him there is no such thing as alteration, no shadow of a change. By his own choice he made us his children by the message of the truth so that we should be a sort of first-fruits of all that he had created.

Accept and submit to the word which has been planted in you and can save your souls. But you must do what the word tells you, and not just listen to it and deceive yourselves.

Pure, unspoilt religion, in the eyes of God our Father is this: coming to the help of orphans and widows when they need it, and keeping oneself uncontaminated by the world.

Gospel

Mark 7:1-8, 14-15, 21-23

You forget the commandments of God to hold on to human tradition.

The Pharisees and some of the scribes who had come from Jerusalem gathered round Jesus, and they noticed that some of his disciples were eating with unclean hands, that is, without washing them. For the Pharisees, and the Jews in general, follow the tradition of the elders and never eat without washing their arms as far as the elbow; and on returning from the market place they never eat without first sprinkling themselves. There are also many other observances which have been handed down to them concerning the washing of cups and pots and bronze dishes. So these Pharisees and scribes asked him, 'Why do your disciples not respect the tradition of the elders but eat their food with unclean hands?' He answered, 'It was of you hypocrites that Isaiah so rightly prophesied in this passage of scripture:

This people honours me only with lip-service, while their hearts are far from me.

The worship they offer me is worthless, the doctrines they teach are only human regulations.

You put aside the commandment of God to cling to human traditions.' He called the people to him again and said, 'Listen to me, all of you, and understand. Nothing that goes into a man from outside can make him unclean; it is the things that come out of a man that make him unclean. For it is from within, from men's hearts, that evil intentions emerge: fornication, theft, murder, adultery, avarice, malice, deceit, indecency, envy, slander, pride, folly. All these evil things come from within and make a man unclean.'
