Domestic Abuse the Silent Pandemic

We hear many women say, "but he didn't hit me so it's not domestic violence". Domestic violence is when one person uses their power and control over another. It includes yelling, throwing things, using finances to control the other person, restricting someone from seeing their friends and/or family, telling someone where they can and cannot go, making someone feel that the abuse is their fault. checking phone messages and social media, using tracking devices, hidden cameras and microphones to monitor their partner, using children as pawns during separation, and threatening to take their own life, sexual assault and physical abuse. It can be one, two ... or all the above.

If you suspect someone is experiencing such violence, the first thing you can do to support them is to listen – without judgement. Validate their concerns. We hear many women say "I didn't think anyone would believe me because they are a great person to everyone else". Assure them that what is happening is not acceptable.

Catholic Care's Central Coast Family Centre in Tuggerah have two domestic violence programs available. More on these programs next week.

First Reading Baruch 5:1-9

Jerusalem –God will show you splendour.

Jerusalem, take off your dress of sorrow and distress, put on the beauty of the glory of God for ever, wrap the cloak of the integrity of God around you, put the diadem of the glory of the Eternal on your head: since God means to show your splendour to every nation under heaven, since the name of God gives you for ever will be, 'Peace through integrity, and honour through devotedness.' Arise, Jerusalem, stand on the heights and turn your eyes to the east: see your sons reassembled from west and east at the command of the Holy One, jubilant that God has remembered them.

Though they left you on foot, with enemies for an escort, now God brings them back to you like royal princes carried back in glory. In the fifteenth year of Tiberius Caesar's reign, when Pontius Pilate was governor of Judaea, Herod tetrarch of Galilee, his brother Philip tetrarch of the land of Ituraea and Trachonitis, Lysanias tetrarch of Abilene, during the pontificate of Annas and Caiaphas the word of God came to John son of Zechariah, in the wilderness. He went through the whole Jordan district proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins, as it is written in the book of the sayings of the prophet Isaiah:

A voice cries in the wilderness:
Prepare a way for the Lord,
make his paths straight.
Every valley will be filled in,
every mountain and hill be laid low,
winding ways will be straightened
