For those in Year 4 or older who have made their Reconciliation:

Enrolment forms will be available through the College and the Parish Office before the end of Term 3.

Classes for MacKillop students in Year 4 will begin in Term 4, with Sr Ji Ji teaching special classes.

Classes for students older than Year 4 or attending other schools will be run by Sr Ji Ji after Sunday 10am Mass on 25 October and 1 November. Much of the preparation may have to be done at home, with parents using the booklet you will receive when the enrolment form is lodged with the parish..

First Communion will be celebrated at **special Masses** at 2pm on Saturday Nov 7th and Sunday Nov 8th; and then at 2pm on the following weekend, Saturday Nov 14th and Sunday Nov 15th.

Young Australians-Mental Health

Three-quarters of people who develop ill-health first experience its symptoms before they are 25 years old.

There is the pressures of education then finding work. Lack of affordable housing, significant debt early in life, and the 'gig economy' can cause huge pressures. This is a time when the 'at risk' can withdraw from family and friends, engage in risk-taking behaviours and form a reliance on drugs and alcohol. Over 3,000 people are lost to suicide each year and those aged 15 to 24 are the most vulnerable. Around 90 per cent of victims experiencing mental ill-health.

If you have younger people in your life, talk to them, make links with mental health networks in our local area, advocate for the rights of individuals and their families and encourage peer-to-peer support.

Matthew 18:15-20

Jesus said to his disciples: "If your brother does something wrong, go and have it out with him alone, between your two selves. If he listens to you, you have won back your brother. If he does not listen, take one or two others along with you: the evidence of two or three witnesses is required to sustain any charge. But if he refuses to listen to these, report it to the community; and if he refuses to listen to the community, treat him like a pagan or a tax collector.

"I tell you solemnly, whatever you bind on earth shall be considered bound in heaven; whatever you loose on earth shall be considered loosed in heaven.

"I tell you solemnly once again, if two of you on earth agree to ask anything at all, it will be granted to you by my Father in heaven. For where two or three meet in my name, I shall be there with them."
