### **Social Justice**

Climate Change – A Spiritual Crisis

Our Australian Catholic Bishops have now released their 2021 Social Justice Statement which is entitled *The Cry of the Earth, The Cry of the Poor.* It uses this saying from Pope Francis summarising his *Laudato Si* encyclical to emphasise that climate change also does have a spiritual dimension.

This point was discussed at some length in a recent article by a Franciscan theologian, Fr Daniel Horan. He said that:

- \* It is interesting to note that more recently the adverse effects of climate change have started to impact many of the most prosperous communities and nations in the world, not just the global poor;
- \* As Pope Francis mentions in *Laudato Si*, the indifference shown by millions of men and women toward climate change is a spiritual crisis as such an attitude shows a lack of recognition of our inherent interconnectedness;
- \* Secondly, the individual and collective inaction is inherently sinful as, quoting Fr James Keenan SJ, "sin is the failure to bother to love" our sisters and brothers;
- \* Thirdly, without prayer there can be no necessary ecological conversion which is necessary if we are to respond appropriately to the sinful indifference to the needs of our sisters and brothers.



# 19th Sunday in Ordinary Time—Year B

First Reading Kings 17:8-16

#### The widow gives food to Elijah, and is fed

And then the word of the Lord came to Elijah, 'Up and go to Zarephath, a Sidonian town, and stay there. I have ordered a widow there to give you food.' So he went off to Sidon. And when he reached the city gate, there was a widow gathering sticks; addressing her he said, 'Please bring me a little water in a vessel for me to drink.' She was setting off to bring it when he called after her. 'Please' he said 'bring me a scrap of bread in your hand.' 'As the Lord your God lives,' she replied 'I have no baked bread, but only a handful of meal in a jar and a little oil in a jug; I am just gathering a stick or two to go and prepare this for myself and my son to eat, and then we shall die.' But Elijah said to her, 'Do not be afraid, go and do as you have said; but first make a little scone of it for me and bring it to me, and then make some for yourself and for your son. For thus the Lord speaks, the God of Israel:

"Jar of meal shall not be spent, jug of oil shall not be emptied, before the day when the Lord sends rain on the face of the earth."

The woman went and did as Elijah told her and they ate the food, she, himself and her son. The jar of meal was not spent nor the jug of oil emptied, just as the Lord had foretold through Elijah.

Gospel Matthew 6:25-34

Do not worry about tomorrow: your holy Father knows your needs.

Jesus said to his disciples: 'I am telling you not to worry about your life and what you are to eat, nor about your body and how you are to clothe it. Surely life means more than food, and the body more than clothing! Look at the birds in the sky. They do not sow or reap or gather into barns; yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not worth much more than they are? Can any of you, for all his worrying, add one single cubit to his span of life? And why worry about clothing? Think of the flowers growing in the fields; they never have to work or spin; yet I assure you that not even Solomon in all his regalia was robed like one of these. Now if that is how God clothes the grass in the field which is there today and thrown into the furnace tomorrow, will he not much more look after you, you men of little faith? So do not worry; do not say, "What are we to eat? What are we to drink? How are we to be clothed?" It is the pagans who set their hearts on all these things. Your heavenly Father knows you need them all. Set your hearts on his kingdom first, and on his righteousness, and all these other things will be given you as well. So do not worry about tomorrow: tomorrow will take care of itself. Each day has enough trouble of its own.'
