

Or: Gaze at the stars and hum 'Star of wonder.'






Gift of Time

Do you have a spare couple of hours? Offer a helping hand to somebody in need.




Gift of Compassion

No criticism over Christmas. Just affirm and love and tolerate.




Gift of Joy

Been grouchy and irritable lately? Make a decision to spread joy and enthusiasm this Christmas.




Gift of Service

Is there a regular chore that somebody can't stand doing? Take it on for the whole of the Christmas season.




Gift of Presence
