### Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord Year C

#### 10th April 2022



#### **HOLY WEEK**

The Gospel according to St. Luke gives an account of Jesus' triumphant entry into Jerusalem - like a King, Messiah and Prophet. It also gives a vivid account of the Passover meal with the institution of the Eucharist at the last supper. After being with him for three years the disciples still have questions and still don't understand what he has been teaching them about service and sacrifice for the sake of the kingdom of God. Jesus is the "Suffering Servant" who speaks to a people enslaved. Their exile is that of weakness and failure. Jesus reaches out to them in soli-

exile is that of weakness and failure. Jesus reaches out to them in solidarity. But they would rather stay imprisoned in their own notions of God and holiness - and of what's right and wrong. They are trapped in their own self-righteousness. And despite the hostility he meets, Jesus is not a defenseless victim and remains faithful to his mission. Jesus' strong sense of commitment to the task entrusted to him rises from the interior strength God renews in him each day. He discovers for himself and proclaims to others the God who is always willing to speak again and always willing to forgive. And that is the God we meet during Holy Week.

The Passion of Christ is not just a past event that we look back upon. We're not just recalling the past. Our proclamation of the Passion must affect our present and our future. Jesus comes to us when our hope is shattered and we want to walk away. He comes to us in the poor and the sick and the frightened and the lonely. He comes to us when we grow weak and feeble because of old age or illness, and he lifts us up with the assurance that he will stay with us through the valley of death until we, too, will rise with him to the fullness of life.

Today's narrative ends at the tomb. But we come to Holy Week not to focus on the Crucified Christ in sadness and sorrow, but to worship the Risen and Living Lord, who challenges us, who transforms us, and who enables us to be courageous witnesses of his presence to others. Let the celebrations of Palm Sunday bring us hope and encouragement in times of pain and sufferings. "Palm Sunday tells us that ... it is the cross that is the true tree of life "- Pope Benedict XVI.


