

Today, we have the parable of the wedding feast. It is a rather strange parable. It is about a great wedding feast given by a King. The wedding feast symbolizes the heavenly banquet prepared by God. In the parable, the King invites all types of people for his son's wedding. But not all are responsive to the invitation. We meet four different groups of people in the parable.

- 1. Those who made light of the King's invitation and did not go for the banquet on different pretexts. They had their own affairs to be busy with, and did not respond to the invitation.
- 2. Those who treated the King's servants shamefully and killed them. These are the evil forces who do not accept God's kingdom and are trying to do away with it at all cost.
- 3. Those who are called from the streets and responded to the invitation of the King. These are the people who are from all nations and are willing to accept God's kingdom. God is willing to accept any person to His kingdom without looking at his/her antecedents.
- 4. Those that refused to wear the wedding garment. These are the people who after accepting the invitation of God are not willing to be part of the privilege they received. It shows their unrepentant way of life.

God is generous in inviting all of us to His banquet. May be we have different reasons to make light of it, totally reject it, or accept it with an open heart. If we accept God's invitation whole-heartedly and unconditionally, we will receive great blessings that only God can dispense.

Understanding COVID-19 Restrictions - Places of Worship Diocese of Broken Bay Fact Sheet

What does this mean for places of worship?

- The number of people in a public place of worship must not exceed one person per 4 square metres.
- When calculating the number of people permissible in the church for a religious service, the Celebrant, concelebrants, Deacon, server and other essential ministers are excluded from the head count. All members of the congregation should be counted, including children.

The calculation must be made by measuring the floor space of the areas open to the public. For our Churches, this means the sanctuary, sacristy, or other areas where people would not congregate are not included in the calculations. The maximum number of people allowed in the church should be displayed on all entry points to the church.

People attending a religious service will be required to provide their name and contact details (phone or email) when they enter so that they can be used for contact tracing. The details of one adult member per household is sufficient. Parishioners are reguested to receive Holy Communion in the hand & are advised to wear a mask during Mass. More details are available on the notice board


