"In today's gospel, Jesus called His disciples to forgive one another unlimited number of times. Jesus' call is for an extravagant character of forgiveness for one another among the disciples. No human relationship is ever possible without forgiveness. Someone said, "Successful married life is the union of two great forgivers."

God in Jesus Christ had forgiven every human person. God has taken the initiative to forgive us; therefore, we are indebted to Him for His forgiveness and we are called to show our gratitude by reflecting His forgiveness to the others. In today's Gospel, Jesus makes it clear that the forgiveness, which we have received from God, is enormous compared to the petty forgiveness we are called to extend towards others. Someone said, "We are like beasts when we kill; we are like men when we judge; we are like God when we forgive." Jesus very clearly indicated in today's parable that no matter how much we forgive others, it is always a pittance compared to the enormous forgiveness we have received from God.

"Blessed are the merciful, for they shall receive mercy (Mt: 5:7)." Those who show mercy to the others will receive mercy in abundance from God. The benefit of forgiveness is, "It saves the expense of anger, the high cost of hatred and the waste of energy." May we heal ourselves by forgiving those who have hurt us, and thus receive God's forgiveness in our lives.

To err is human but to forgive is Divine.

<u>Understanding COVID-19 Restrictions – Places of Worship Diocese of Broken Bay Fact Sheet</u>

What does this mean for places of worship?

- The number of people in a public place of worship must not exceed one person per 4 square metres.
- When calculating the number of people permissible in the church for a religious service, the Celebrant, concelebrants, Deacon, server and other essential ministers are excluded from the head count. All members of the congregation should be counted, including children.

The calculation must be made by measuring the floor space of the areas open to the public. For our Churches, this means the sanctuary, sacristy, or other areas where people would not congregate are not included in the calculations. The maximum number of people allowed in the church should be displayed on all entry points to the church.

People attending a religious service will be required to provide their name and contact details (phone or email) when they enter so that they can be used for contact tracing. The details of one adult member per household is sufficient. Parishioners are requested to receive Holy Communion in the hand & are advised to wear a mask during Mass. More details are available on the notice board

Peter went up to Jesus and said, 'Lord, how often must I forgive my brother if he wrongs me? As often as seven times?' Jesus answered, 'Not seven, I tell you, but seventyseven times.

'And so the kingdom of heaven may be compared to a king who decided to settle his accounts with his servants. When the reckoning began, they brought him a man who owed ten thousand talents; but he had no means of paying, so his master gave orders that he should be sold, together with his wife and children and all his possessions, to meet the debt. At this, the servant threw himself down at his master's feet. "Give me time," he said, "and I will pay the whole sum." And the servant's master felt so sorry for him that he let him go and cancelled the debt. Now as this servant went out, he happened to meet a fellow servant who owed him one hundred denarii; and he seized him by the throat and began to throttle him. "Pay what you owe me," he said. His fellow servant fell at his feet and implored him, saying, "Give me time and I will pay you." But the other would not agree; on the contrary, he had him thrown into prison till he should pay the debt. His fellow servants were deeply distressed when they saw what had happened, and they went to their master and reported the whole affair to him. Then the master sent for him. "You wicked servant," he said, "I cancelled all that debt of yours when you appealed to me. Were you not bound, then, to have pity on your fellow servant just as I had pity on you?" And in his anger the master handed him over to the torturers till he should pay all his debt. And that is how my heavenly Father will deal with you unless you each forgive your brother from your heart.'
