Lent a Season of Renewal

Pope Francis urged Catholics to use the season of Lent to spend less time immersed in the chatter and noise of the world through television and their phones, and to spend more time in silence and in conversation with God. "Lent is the right time to make room for the Word of God. It is the time to turn off the television and open the Bible. It is the time to disconnect from your mobile phone and connect to the Gospel".

This penitential period, is also the time to work on giving up gossip, rumours, and useless chatter, focusing instead on giving yourself to the Lord, who spent 40 days in the desert in fasting and prayer. During Lent, Jesus is "calling us into the desert," the 'desert' of Lent, where we can be in conversation with the Lord, becomes a life-giving place. "We chase a thousand things that seem necessary and in reality are not. How good it would be for us to get rid of so many superfluous realities, to rediscover what matters, to find the faces of those around us!" he urged.

"Prayer, fasting, works of mercy: here is the road into the Lenten desert." "In the desert one finds intimacy with God, the love of the Lord," he stated. "The road that leads us from death to life opens up in the desert. We enter the desert with Jesus, we will go out savouring Easter..."

Dear friends, Lent is the favourable season for renewing our encounter with Christ, living in his word, in the sacraments and in our neighbour. The Lord, who overcame the deceptions of the Tempter during the forty days in the desert, shows us the path we must take. May the Holy Spirit lead us on a true journey of conversion, so that we can rediscover the gift of God's word, be purified of the sin that blinds us, and serve Christ present in our brothers and sisters in need. Let us pray for one another so that, by sharing in the victory of Christ, we may open our doors to the weak and poor. Then we will be able to experience and share to the full the joy of Easter.
