Body and Blood of Christ Year A

14th June 2020

"Life Giving Jesus in the Eucharist"



Today we celebrate the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ, popularly known as "Corpus Christi Day." In this Holy Mass we should thank God in a special way for having remained with us in the Most Holy Sacrament. It was in the 13th century that Pope Urban IV officially instituted this great solemnity in the universal Catholic Church. In Today's Gospel Jesus explains to His disciples and followers that to be part of Him, it is essential that they eat His body and drink His blood. Jesus is the living bread which alone gives eternal life.

Jesus fulfilled His teaching on Eucharist by offering His body and blood to His disciples at the last supper. The feast of Corpus Christi recalls to our mind all that Jesus did to give His own life for us, especially the offer of His body and blood signify the totality of self-gift. The celebration of the Eucharist implies serious challenges and obligations for every Christian. More than mere participation, it implies that a Christ like life is necessary. The grace of Eucharist pours into us by our faith opening ourselves to Christ's gift of Himself. Our great Amen just before the Our Father states the we also are willing to die to sin and rise to life. Lord, remind me that the Eucharist is not just a meal to be shared, but a mission to be lived.

Message from Bishop Anthony

The Archdiocese of Sydney has developed a site to assist parishes throughout Australia as they respond to the easing of restrictions and the introduction of public Masses again. It is called massregister.com.au.

Bishop Anthony has recommended its use throughout our own Diocese of Broken Bay – though it is for individual parishes to consider its merit and to decide on its implementation.

Places of Worship

The following limitations apply to the number of people allowed within the premises:

For a **Mass, a Baptism, a funeral, a memorial, or other religious service, or for private worship** - the lesser of:

50 persons; or the total number of persons calculated by allowing 4 square metres of space for each person on the premises.

For a **wedding** the lesser of 20 Persons; or the total number of persons calculated by allowing 4 square metres of space for each person on the premises.
