"The Parable of the Talents"

In this parable of the talents, there are three servants and each of them is given a certain amount of money by their Master and went for a journey. The first and the second are industrious whereas the third servant is lazy and a man of excuses. On his return, the Master asks for an account of the money he had entrusted with them. The first servant and the second are praised for their hard work and shrewdness. But the third servant is severely chastised for his laziness and lack of resourcefulness.

Jesus told this parable to explain to us how we should make use of our abilities and talents which are God given. It is certainly not about making money or accumulating wealth for oneself. Through this parable, Jesus is telling us about using our precious time and God given gifts to seek the Kingdom of God. We are expected to develop these gifts and grow as humans and children of God. It is by living that we discover our talents, and it is by using them that we grow. What matters is not how much we have multiplied, but how faithful we have been to the given task.

In spite of some negative touch, the parable has a lot of positive and encouraging aspects. Two out of three servants heard those magic words from the Master: "Well done". To all who are doing their best, to live good lives, the Lord is speaking those words of encouragement, "Well done, good and faithful servant". Hence the parable reveals the trust, the confidence and the generosity of God towards each one of us.

Understanding COVID-19 Restrictions – Places of Worship Diocese of Broken Bay Fact Sheet

As you may be aware, the NSW Government announced recently the easing of various COVID restrictions, including those related to places of public worship. To summarise, from Friday 23 October 2020;

Under Public Health Orders, all places of public worship in NSW must complete a COVID-19 Safety Plan for each building used. It must be kept up to date as changes occur using the latest template, currently dated 28th September 2020. The newest template has incorporated the aspects of the different requirements for Weddings and Funerals as well as recommending the use of Face Masks. All places of public worship must register as COVID Safe. The place of pubic worship must ensure that if they are running con-current services, meetings or events on the one property in separate areas or buildings, that the start and finish times do not overlap, to avoid over-crowding and mingling outside. Maximum capacity for religious services apart from weddings and funerals, is up to 300 people or one person per 4 square metres of space, whichever is less. Maximum capacity for Weddings, is up to 150 people, or one guest per 4 square metres, whichever is the lesser, may attend a wedding service in a place of public worship. Maximum capacity for a funeral, 100 people, or one guest per 4 square metres, whichever is the lesser, may attend a funeral or memorial service in a place of public worship.

These numbers exclude staff/essential ministers. Children count towards the capacity limit in places of public worship Musicians - A small group of up to 5 people may sing together in a large well-ventilated (preferably outdoor) area if: all singers face forwards and not towards each other have physical distancing of 1.5 metres between each other and any other performers, and 5 metres from all other people including the audience and conductor. Ensembles and other musical groups should rehearse and perform outdoors or in large, well-ventilated indoor spaces. In relation to hospitality after Masses or other church events in a meeting room or hall: a maximum of 30 people are allowed to gather outside, or a maximum of 20 inside. No buffet food is allowable. People can bring their own food. And in relation to record keeping, a place of public worship must:

Keep a record of the name and contact number or email and hold the record for 28 days in a confidential and secure manner. Protect the personal details being collected to avoid disclosure to other visitors. Ensure records are used only for the purpose of tracing, if required by NSW Health.

Parishioners are requested to receive Holy Communion in the hand & are advised to wear a mask during Mass. More details are available on the notice board.
