The Ascension of the Lord

16th May 2021



As Jesus prepared His disciples for the coming of the Spirit, He prayed in a very loving and intimate way for those to whom he was entrusting his mission. But his prayer looked far beyond these first disciples. As we celebrate the feast of the Ascension, and anticipating the gift of the Spirit on Pentecost, Jesus' words take on an additional meaning today for us.

Jesus prays for those who are dear to Him, but he knows that it will not be his miracles that will engender faith; it will not be his message that sparks

truth. Only when the lives of his followers project a unique and genuine oneness will their witness be authentic and compelling. And so, we see him praying for four things - unity, joy, holiness, and mission.

Jesus left his followers with a mission that would provide the impetus for all they were to do - to take the knowledge of salvation to the entire world - no small task. This mission provides focus and meaning for our existence. It is only by staying focused on the mission that we remain alert, open to the gift of the Spirit and ready to fulfill the vision of the reign of God

The Ascension story is a mission given to us. Pentecost is our rebirth in the Spirit. The original fire of the Gospel must burn in us. This gift must bring excitement, passion, and courage to us. We must shake off complacency, intolerance, and indifference. The Spirit must become our strength, our light, our hope, and our joy. It must become the driving force for all activity. What could be more urgent and necessary for us than awakening our passion for faithfulness to Jesus? He is the best the Church has to give; the best we can offer and communicate to today's world. Jesus is the center of our lives – everything else comes later.

<u>Capacity:</u> Capacity at a place of public worship <u>continues to be subject</u> to the one <u>person per 2 square metre</u> rule. Children count towards the capacity limit. Our capacity: St Mary's: 235, St Brendan's: 320

Please do not enter the Church if you feel unwell.

<u>Masks:</u> UPDATE—until Mon 17th May, <u>masks must be worn</u> in our Churches.

Record Keeping: Everyone entering the Church must sign in with their name and contact number, preferably using the QR code, or on the paper sheet provided. <u>Please write clearly</u>. The Parish office will hold the record for 28 days confidentially and securely.

<u>Seating</u>: please sit only where marked, to maintain physical distancing requirements. Members of the same household may sit together. Seating signs are staggered to allow for physical distancing, so please adhere to these signs.

<u>Singing:</u> UPDATE—until Mon 17th May Congregational <u>Singing is</u> not permitted in Places of Worship.

<u>Holy Communion:</u> Parishioners are requested to receive Holy Communion in the hand and adhere to 1.5m physical distancing while processing to Communion. Those wishing to receive Holy Communion on the tongue are advised to wait at the end of the Communion line.

<u>No Gathering</u>: Parishioners are asked to move away promptly from the Church after Mass has finished.

<u>No Sharing Food:</u> Please remember that any meetings we hold <u>must not involve</u> sharing of food. If food is served, it must be individual serves on separate plates/containers, or participants must bring their own food.

Offertory Procession: due to easing of COVID restrictions, we are now able to resume the Offertory Procession.

<u>Children's Liturgy</u> will resume on the 1st & 3rd Sundays of each month at 9.00am Mass at St Mary's, commencing from 16th May.

First Reading

Acts 1:1-11

Why are you standing here looking into the sky? Jesus has been taken into heaven.

In my earlier work, Theophilus, I dealt with everything Jesus had done and taught from the beginning until the day he gave his instructions to the apostles he had chosen through the Holy Spirit, and was taken up to heaven. He had shown himself alive to them after his Passion by many demonstrations: for forty days he had continued to appear to them and tell them about the kingdom of God. When he had been at table with them, he had told them not to leave Jerusalem, but to wait there for what the Father had promised. 'It is' he had said 'what you have heard me speak about: John baptised with water but you, not many days from now, will be baptised with the Holy Spirit. Now having met together, they asked him, 'Lord, has the time come? Are you going to restore the kingdom to Israel?' He replied, 'It is not for you to know times or dates that the Father has decided by his own authority, but you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you, and then you will be my witnesses not only in Jerusalem but throughout Judaea and Samaria, and indeed to the ends of the earth.'

As he said this he was lifted up while they looked on, and a cloud took him from their sight. They were still staring into the sky when suddenly two men in white were standing near them and they said, 'Why are you men from Galilee standing here looking into the sky? Jesus who has been taken up from you into heaven, this same Jesus will come back in the same way as you have seen him go there.'

Do all you can to preserve the unity of the spirit by the peace that binds you together. There is one Body, one Spirit, just as you were all called into one and the same

hope when you were called. There is one Lord, one faith, one baptism, and one God who is father of all, over all, through all and within all.

Each one of us, however, has been given his own share of grace, given as Christ allotted it. The one who rose higher than all the heavens to fill all things is none other than the one who descended. And to some his gift was that they should be apostles; to some, prophets; to some, evangelists; to some, pastors and teachers; so that the saints together make a unity in the work of service, building up the body of Christ. In this way we are all to come to unity in our faith and in our knowledge of the Son of God, until we become the perfect Man, fully mature with the fullness of Christ himself.
