THE VIRTUE OF HOSPITALITY

The central themes of today's readings are the importance of hospitality in Christian life and the necessity of listening to God before acting. The key to the Christian life is setting priorities: Jesus Christ first, then everything else. The only way really to learn that lesson is to spend some time every day, "sitting at the feet of Jesus." First reading explains the hospitality shown to three strangers by Abraham and Sarah and how he welcomes them. By welcoming those three, he in fact is welcoming the Lord God. Abraham displays the warmth of friendship and hospitality. The hospitality of the couple is amply rewarded & the Lord God promises them a son in answer to their deepest desire.

In today's Gospel reading we meet two sisters - Martha and Mary - who show great hospitality to Jesus when He visits them. Martha becomes fully engaged in preparing a meal while Mary sits at the feet of Jesus and listens to His life-giving teachings. Martha is busy to the point of distraction. In all her fret and fuss, Martha is missing one thing that is needed: to welcome the Lord by listening to His precious words. Jesus praises Mary for setting the priorities right. Hence true hospitality according to Jesus is to listen to His Word and live according to it. Listening to the Word of God should take precedence over all our other cares and concerns.

Martha has become a symbol of you and me in the modern world. We have become so active and busy with living our lives that we no longer have time to slow down and quietly listen to God, or even to our spouse, kids, or friends. We become so active in doing good things that our activities become a cover-up for our lack of listening and quiet caring. Human love begins at home, and it begins with listening. "True hospitality is marked by open response to the dignity of each and every person." - K. Norris.



First Reading Genesis 18:1-10 A reading from the book of Genesis *Lord, do not bypass your servant.*

The Lord appeared to Abraham at the Oak of Mamre while he was sitting by the entrance of the tent during the hottest part of the day. He looked up, and there he saw three men standing near him.
