Gospel Reflection

In today's Gospel, Jesus illustrates the parable of the rich fool. Jesus warns us against all types of greed, because greed takes our life's focus away from God and away from serving and loving Him in Himself and in other people. This parable was told in the context of a dispute between two brothers regarding their property. Jesus was asked by one of them to mediate and divide their inheritance between them. Jesus reminds him and all of us that life is much more than the abundance of a person's possessions. Then Jesus tells the parable of the rich man. He is extremely wealthy and yet he desires to store up his bumper crop for greater security and happiness. Jesus calls him a fool because he neglected three most important factors for real and lasting happiness. He forgot God - he does not even have a little thought that all his possessions are gifts from the Almighty. He forgot eternal life - he is merely looking for temporal happiness in this world. He totally ignores his obligation to the poor and to the needy.

Our greed takes different shapes and forms. For some, it may be the desire for the approval and praise of others. For others, it is the uncontrolled desire for power, control, or fame. For still others, greed takes the form of excessive and sinful indulgence in eating, drinking, gambling, drugs etc. This parable seriously warns every one of us to take stock of the things and possession in our lives in the context of eternal life.

Second Reading Colossians 3:1-5, 9-11 A reading from the letter of St Paul to Colossians Seek the things that are above where Christ is.

Since you have been brought back to true life with Christ, you must look for the things that are in heaven, where Christ is, sitting at God's right hand. Let your thoughts be on heavenly things, not on the things that are on the earth, because you have died, and now the life you have is hidden with Christ in God. But when Christ is revealed - and he is your life - you too will be revealed in all your glory with him.

That is why you must kill everything in you that belongs only to earthly life: fornication, impurity, guilty passion, evil desires and especially greed, which is the same thing as worshipping a false god; and never tell each other lies. You have stripped off your old behaviour with your old self, and you have put on a new self which will progress towards true knowledge the more it is renewed in the image of its creator; and, in that image there is no room for distinction between Greek and Jew, between the circumcised or the uncircumcised, or between barbarian and Scythian, slave and free man. There is only Christ: he is everything and he is in everything.
