Capacity: Capacity at a place of public worship or at a religious gathering, must not exceed one visitor per 2 square metres of publicly accessible space. This refers to services both indoors and outdoors. There is no upper limit for this restriction. Children count towards the capacity limit. Please do not enter the Church if you feel unwell.

Masks: wearing a mask is recommended but not mandatory.

Record Keeping: Parishioners must sign in with their name and contact number (or email) when attending Church premises. The Parish office will hold the record for 28 days in a confidential and secure manner. **Seating**: please sit only where marked, to maintain physical distancing requirements. Members of the same household may sit together. Seating signs are staggered to allow for physical distancing, so please adhere to

Singing: We are now allowed to have up to 50 performers singing indoors, however as this will not allow our whole congregation to sing, we will limit singing to our Musicians & Choir only.

Holy Communion: Parishioners are requested to receive Holy Communion in the hand and adhere to 1.5m physical distancing while processing to Communion.

No Gathering: Parishioners must move away promptly from the Church after Mass has finished.

Mental Health First Aid Training – Course Offer

I would like to offer another course for our parishioners. These are introductory special courses for our Parish. I plan to offer the course more broadly next year. Mental Health First Aid is Nationally Accredited Training and I am an Accredited Trainer. The training is over two days in the first week of January. \$30 per participant which covers the textbook and materials. Aims to build skills and confidence to support friends, colleagues and others during struggles with mental health. About 1 in 5 Australian adults experiences a common mental illness each year. Mental Health First Aid Training will teach you practical skills to support someone with a mental health problem. If you are interested in training to be an accredited mental health first aider, please let me know.

What you can expect from mental health first aid training.

KNOWLEDGE - Improves knowledge of mental illnesses, treatments and first aid actions.

CONFIDENCE - Increases confidence in providing first aid.

DE-STIGMATISING - Decreases stigmatising attitudes.

SUPPORT - Increases the support provided to others.
