

Twenty-First Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year C

21st August 2022



In Today's Gospel passage Jesus is questioned by one of the listeners regarding the number of people who will be eventually saved. The questioner was obviously anxious to know about his salvation and the salvation of others. While replying to this question Jesus exhorts everyone to enter by the narrow door. Jesus tells them that anyone who follows him through the narrow gate of sacrificial serving and sharing love will be saved. It is the *narrow way* of unconditional and unremitting love. Some of the Fathers of the Church interpreted the *narrow door* as that small place in the heart where one says "yes" or "no" to what one knows to be true. Jesus told parable of a house owner (God) who closed the door (at night) and many desiring to enter through that door. They gave many reasons so that they could be admitted: eating and drinking with him, living in his neighbourhood etc. But the master of the house was not convinced and dismissed them from his presence.

It is our choice whether to enter by the narrow door which leads us to eternal life or to enter through the wide door which leads to eternal damnation. Hence the message is that entering the Kingdom of God is not restricted to just a few but to people from every community and nationality. But the path of Jesus will give access to the Kingdom. Each day sees endings and opportunities missed. "Opportunity will not knock twice at your door."




