Gospel Reflection

Enter by the narrow door

In the first reading Prophet Isaiah speaks about a time of universal salvation. He elaborates that the Lord God is going to gather all nations and language groups into one-fold. The Lord God in His goodness, love and mercy wants to gather the dispersed people and bring reconciliation to everyone.

Second reading explains that every father disciplines his son/daughter. If we are disciplined and chastised by God, it is a sure sign that God treats us as His own children. God trains us, His children through many sufferings so that we may grow to maturity and reach our goal. Hence discipline, training and perseverance are essential prerequisites of the final glory that we will experience in the future.

In today's gospel Jesus exhorts everyone to enter by the narrow door. Then He narrates the parable of a house owner (God) who closed the door (at night) and many desire to enter through that door. It is our personal choice whether to enter through the narrow door (difficult life) which leads us to eternal life or to enter through the wide door (easy life) which leads us to eternal damnation. Hence the message is that entering the kingdom of God is not restricted to just a few people but people from every nationality and various communities. The path of Jesus (the narrow door) gives access to the kingdom of God.
