Solemnity of Christ the King,
Thirty-Fourth Sunday Ordinary Time Year A
22nd November 2020



In today's Gospel the last judgement scene is described in detail. At the last judgement, Jesus will come as a judge and separate the good and evil. The King will tell those on his right - those who are blessed - 'as you did it to one of the least of my brothers and sisters, you did it me'. Those admitted to His Kingdom are not people who have done anything spectacular in the eyes of the world. The requirement to be part of the Kingdom is very simple and does not go beyond the capacity of any ordinary person. The actions are simple responses to the human needs.

For Christ, simple human graciousness and charity are ground enough to be welcomed into the fullness of the Kingdom. Jesus looks upon every kindness done to a person in need however lowly as a kindness done to Himself.

Those who are excluded from His Kingdom - those cursed - have brought doom upon themselves because they failed to respond to simple human needs. Hence, if we want to honour our King, we must do something to the least of His brothers and sisters in need.

"The biggest disease in the world today is not leprosy, TB or Aids but the feeling of being unwanted and uncared for. The greatest evil in the world is lack of love, the terrible indifference towards one's neighbour. What the poor need even more than food, clothes and shelter is to be wanted" - St. Mother Teresa of Calcutta.

Understanding COVID-19 Restrictions – Places of Worship Diocese of Broken Bay

Religious Services: (apart from weddings and funerals) maximum capacity is 300 people or one person per 4 square metres of space, whichever is less. For our Churches, this number is 100. Con-current services, meetings or events on the one property in separate areas or buildings, must have different start and finish times, to avoid over-crowding and mingling outside.

Weddings: up to 150 people, or one guest per 4 square metres, whichever is the lesser, may attend a wedding service in a place of public worship. For our Churches, this number is 100.

Funerals: 100 people, or one guest per 4 square metres, whichever is the lesser, may attend a funeral or memorial service in a place of public worship. For our Churches, this number is 100.

Note: These numbers exclude staff/essential ministers. Children count towards the capacity limit in places of public worship.

Musicians: A small group of up to 5 people may sing together in a large well-ventilated (preferably outdoor) area if: all singers face forwards and not towards each other have physical distancing of 1.5 metres between each other and any other performers, and 5 metres from all other people including the audience and conductor. No singing is allowed in the congregation. Ensembles and other musical groups should rehearse and perform outdoors or in large, well-ventilated indoor spaces.

Hospitality after Masses or other Church events in a meeting room or hall: a maximum of 30 people are allowed to gather outside, or a maximum of 20 inside. No buffet food is allowable. People can bring their own food.

Record Keeping: Parishes must keep a record of the name and contact number or email of those attending Church premises and hold the record for 28 days in a confidential and secure manner.

Parishioners are requested to receive Holy Communion in the hand & are encouraged to wear a mask during Mass. More details are available on the notice board.

Next he will say to those on his left hand, "Go away from me, with your curse upon you, to the eternal fire prepared for the devil and his angels. For I was hungry and you never gave me food; I was thirsty and you never gave me anything to drink; I was a stranger and you never made me welcome, naked and you never clothed me, sick and in prison and you never visited me." Then it will be their turn to ask, "Lord, when did we see you hungry or thirsty, a stranger or naked, sick or in prison, and did not come to your help?" Then he will answer, "I tell you solemnly, in so far as you neglected to do this to one of the least of these, you neglected to do it to me." And they will go away to eternal punishment, and the virtuous to eternal life.'
