Gospel ReflectionVirtue of Humility

Luke's Gospel has a unique focus on the significance of sharing a meal at table. He presents his Gospel in a way that makes this very human activity and Christ's message inseparable, and he does this by framing the narrative as a great journey. Along the way, meals and hospitality play a critical role for Jesus and his followers. One such occasion becomes a springboard for a parable which teaches us much about God and about ourselves.

First reading speaks about the great virtue of humility. It tells us that a humble person is open to the promptings of the Lord God and never rejects wisdom, no matter where it comes from. Humility is the sign of true greatness. The greater a person is, the humbler he/she should be. The message is: be humble and you will find favour with the Lord God. Whoever humbles himself will be exalted.

In today's Gospel Jesus instructs the disciples; When you are invited to a function, do not occupy places of honour. Because in case a person more worthy than you is invited, the host may come and request you to give the honourable place to that person. Consequently, you will be put in an embarrassing and humiliating situation. However, if you are occupying a less honourable place and the host requests you to occupy a more honourable place, you will be honoured in the presence of everyone present. Hence the virtue of humility is of great importance in the life of a follower of Christ. It ranks right up there with the great Gospel values. Thus, for Jesus, to lose one's life is to find it. The last shall be the first and the humble shall be exalted.

"Do you wish to raise yourself: Begin by humbling yourself." - St. Augustine. "It is in being humble that our love becomes real, devoted and ardent." - St. Mother Teresa of Calcutta.


<u>New Parishioner Forms</u> - There is now a new Parishioner form available in both churches for individual or families to register in the Parish.

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke *All who exalt themselves shall be humbled and all who humble themselves shall be exalted*

On a sabbath day Jesus had gone for a meal to the house of one of the leading Pharisees; and they watched him closely. He then told the guests a parable, because he had noticed how they picked the places of honour. He said this, 'When someone invites you to a wedding feast, do not take your seat in the place of honour. A more distinguished person than you may have been invited, and the person who invited you both may come and say, "Give up your place to this man." And then, to your embarrassment, you would have to go and take the lowest place. No; when you are a guest, make your way to the lowest place and sit there, so that, when your host comes, he may say, "My friend, move up higher." In that way, everyone with you at the table will see you honoured. For everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, and the man who humbles himself will be exalted.'

Then he said to his host, 'When you give a lunch or a dinner, do not ask your friends, brothers, relations or rich neighbours, for fear they repay your courtesy by inviting you in return. No; when you have a party, invite the poor, the crippled, the lame, the blind; that they cannot pay you back means that you are fortunate, because repayment will be made to you when the virtuous rise again.'
