

St Peter, Foundation of the Church



At the heart of the Gospel message is the challenge to articulate who we believe Jesus to be. Peter was the first disciple to acknowledge openly that Jesus was the promised Messiah. "Who do you say that I am?" Peter was asked. Jesus puts his question to Peter, and to us, he isn't asking about public opinion. He is inviting a conversion of heart from his disciples; a confession of faith that results in a lifetime commitment and a changed life.

The Jews were convinced that the Messiah would come in the form of a great warrior king in the tradition of King David. Peter was right about Jesus being a Messiah, "the Christ."

Jesus comes to us, always ready to enrich our lives, always ready.

Jesus comes to us, always ready to enrich our lives, always ready to move us into the fullness of life. If we can't accept Him as He truly is, then there can be no room in our life for Him. In order to make room, it may be necessary to relinquish certain things we want to cling to -- certain attitudes, or certain habits or certain ideas. It may be painful, even agonizing to do so, but until the change occurs, until that which is blocking out the Christ is relinquished, no amount of going to church and no amount of self-pity over life's frustrations will open the door to Jesus. This is called *conversion of heart*.

Accepting the Messiah on His terms means believing in His promise that though you die, yet shall you live. Jesus challenges us again with the same very basic question: "Who do you say that I am?" Thomas Merton once wrote that the only way in which we can at last understand who God is and enter into the possession of the reality of God - which lies at the very roots of our existence - is to stop talking about it - and to grasp the reality... laying our hands on it, by just living it out in our daily lives. Only then will we truly come to know who Jesus is, and who we really are.

<u>Understanding COVID-19 Restrictions – Places of Worship Diocese of Broken Bay Fact Sheet</u>

What does this mean for places of worship?

- The number of people in a public place of worship must not exceed one person per 4 square metres.
- When calculating the number of people permissible in the church for a religious service, the Celebrant, concelebrants, Deacon, server and other essential ministers are excluded from the head count. All members of the congregation should be counted, including children. The calculation must be made by measuring the floor space of the areas open to the public. For our Churches, this means the sanctuary, sacristy, or other areas where people would not congregate are not included in the calculations. The maximum number of people allowed in the church should be displayed on all entry points to the church.

People attending a religious service will be required to provide their name and contact details (phone or email) when they enter so that they can be used for contact tracing. The details of one adult member per household is sufficient. Parishioners are requested to receive Holy Communion in the hand & are advised to wear a mask during Mass. More details are available on the notice board

Dear parishioners, Year 4 students from St. Mary's and St. Brendan's and some from our public schools will be receiving their First Eucharist on two weekends starting the 12th of Sept. 2020. The students are encouraged to attend our weekend Masses and they will personally ask you with prayer cards for prayers to uplift them on their special day. Thank you.


