The Cost of Discipleship

Dear friends, today we celebrate the Feast of Our Lady of Perpetual Succour at St. Mary's. This is the feast of big family of our Parish community inviting all of us to take Our Mother Mary as our mother and seek her protection. Our Lady of Perpetual Succour is a title given to the Blessed Virgin Mary, emphasizing her unfailing eagerness to pray for the welfare of human beings, especially those who seek her intercession.

Today's Gospel passage describes how Jesus resolutely took the road to Jerusalem though He knew that rejection and suffering awaited Him there. Jesus reminds us of the cost of discipleship. He demands unwavering commitment from His followers. On His way to Jerusalem, three persons met Him. To the first person who wanted to follow Him Jesus warned him that there is hardly any place of rest for him if he were to follow Him.

The second person was called by Jesus. But he expressed his inability to follow Jesus because of his religious duty of burying his father who was dead. But Jesus told him "Let the dead bury their own dead" - implying that Jesus extends the boundaries of religion beyond traditions. The third person wanted to follow Jesus but before that he wanted to bid farewell to his family members. He too was found wanting because of his attachment to his family. Hence following Jesus is of such importance that there is no room for any excuses or for compromises or for any kind of half-hearted responses. Let's follow Him with undivided hearts.



1 Kings 19:16, 19-21

Elisha rose and followed Elijah and became his servant.

My brothers, you were called, as you know, to liberty; but be careful, or this liberty will provide an opening for self-indulgence. Serve one another, rather, in works of love, since the whole of the Law is summarised in a single command: Love your neighbour as yourself. If you go snapping at each other and tearing each other

to pieces, you had better watch or you will destroy the whole community.

Let me put it like this: if you are guided by the Spirit you will be in no danger of yielding to self-indulgence, since self-indulgence is the opposite of the Spirit, the Spirit is totally against such a thing, and it is precisely because the two are so opposed that you do not always carry out your good intentions. If you are led by the Spirit, no law can touch you.
