Twenty-Second Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year C



"HUMILITY: THE MOTHER OF ALL VIRTUES"

Today's first reading from the book of Sirach speaks about the great virtue of humility. It tells us that a humble person is open to the promptings of the Lord God and never rejects wisdom no matter where it comes. Humility is the sign of true greatness. The greater a person is the humbler he/she should be. The message is to be humble, and you will find favour with the Lord God. Humility may be the least understood and most maligned of Christian virtues.

In today's Gospel, St. Luke, narrates an incident where Jesus and His disciples were invited to a Pharisee's house for dinner. Many prominent people from the town were invited. Most of them were eager to take the best available seat because each one of them considered himself more important than all others. Jesus observing this taught His disciples a lesson in humility.

This is what He tells them and us: when you are invited to a function, do not occupy places of honour. Because in case a person more worthy than you is invited the host may come and request you to give the honourable place to that person. Consequently, you will be put in an embarrassing and humiliating situation. However, if you are occupying a less honourable place and the host requests you to occupy a more honourable place you will be honoured in the presence of every one present. Hence the virtue of humility is of great importance in the life of a follower of Christ. It ranks right up there with the great Gospel values. Thus, for Jesus to lose one's life is to find it. The last shall be the first and the humble shall be exalted.

The point of the parable is this: When the reign of God comes in its fullness, God will bestow honour on all of us at the banquet table. By claiming to be part of the body of Christ, we are not professing that we are better than everyone else. Rather, we are proclaiming true humility: that we know who we are - sinners, welcomed to the banquet where we are shown once again that we are forgiven friends of God and table companions with Jesus.



Luke 14:1, 7-14

All who exalt themselves shall be humbled and all who humble themselves shall be exalted.

On a sabbath day Jesus had gone for a meal to the house of one of the leading Pharisees; and they watched him closely. He then told the guests a parable, because he had noticed how they picked the places of honour. He said this, 'When someone invites you to a wedding feast, do not take your seat in the place of honour. A more distinguished person than you may have been invited, and the person who invited you both may come and say, "Give up your place to this man." And then, to your embarrassment, you would have to go and take the lowest place. No; when you are a guest, make your way to the lowest place and sit there, so that, when your host comes, he may say, "My friend, move up higher." In that way, everyone with you at the table will see you honoured. For everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, and the man who humbles himself will be exalted.'

Then he said to his host, 'When you give a lunch or a dinner, do not ask your friends, brothers, relations or rich neighbours, for fear they repay your courtesy by inviting you in return. No; when you have a party, invite the poor, the crippled, the lame, the blind; that they cannot pay you back means that you are fortunate, because repayment will be made to you when the virtuous rise again.'
