The Ascension of the Lord

29th May 2022



The First reading today gives us a vivid description of Jesus' final instructions to His disciples followed by His glorious Ascension to heaven. Jesus promised them power from above by the coming of the Holy Spirit and commanded them to be witnesses to Him in Jerusalem and throughout the whole world.

Today's Gospel passage gives us a message of the Risen Lord on the day of His Ascension. He summed up for the disciples the meaning of His death and His resurrection. Jesus then commissioned them to preach the good news to all nations. Before they began their mission journeys, they were asked to wait for the coming of the Holy Spirit who will teach them all things and guide them. Jesus then blessed them and departed to heaven as they were watching. When Apostles realized what had happened to Jesus they were filled with joy because not only Jesus is risen from the dead but that he is now in heavenly glory seated at the right hand of God the Father.

Although Jesus has ascended into heaven, we must not look upon Him as being far away from us. He wants every one of us to be witnesses to His presence in the world. With His Ascension Jesus withdrew His physical presence from His disciples and from the world. But physical absence does not always mean absence of presence. People can be very close to one another even though they are separated by thousands of miles. So also, although Jesus has ascended into heaven, He is still present among us.

"When Christ returned to heaven, he withdrew his physical presence from our sight. He didn't stop being with disciples but by the ascension fulfilled his promise to be with us to the end of the world. Let us pray, God our Father, make us joyful in the Ascension of your son Jesus Christ. May we follow Him into the new creation for His Ascension is our glory and our hope.



First Reading

Acts 1:1-11

Why are you standing here looking into the sky? Jesus has been taken into heaven.

In my earlier work, Theophilus, I dealt with everything Jesus had done and taught from the beginning until the day he gave his instructions to the apostles he had chosen through the Holy Spirit, and was taken up to heaven. He had shown himself alive to them after his Passion by many demonstrations: for forty days he had continued to appear to them and tell them about the kingdom of God. When he had been at table with them, he had told them not to leave Jerusalem, but to wait there for what the Father had promised. 'It is' he had said 'what you have heard me speak about: John baptised with water but you, not many days from now, will be baptised with the Holy Spirit.'

Now having met together, they asked him, 'Lord, has the time come? Are you going to restore the kingdom to Israel?' He replied, 'It is not for you to know times or dates that the Father has decided by his own authority, but you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you, and then you will be my witnesses not only in Jerusalem but throughout Judaea and Samaria, and indeed to the ends of the earth.'

As he said this he was lifted up while they looked on, and a cloud took him from their sight. They were still staring into the sky when suddenly two men in white were standing near them and they said, 'Why are you men from Galilee standing here looking into the sky? Jesus who has been taken up from you into heaven, this same Jesus will come back in the same way as you have seen him go there.'
