PERSEVERANCE IN PRAYER

Jesus was a great story-teller and people loved to listen as He taught through parables. People understood the message of the parables because these stories dealt with ordinary, day-to-day experiences that they were all familiar with. But they loved these stories for another reason as well. Most of the time these stories disturbed the comfortable and comforted the disturbed.

Today's first reading is a description about the first battle fought by Israelites after their deliverance from Egypt. Joshua and the men of Israel are at war with Amalek. During the time of the war Moses, Aron and Hur prays for the victory of Israel. Moses prays to the Lord God with outstretched hands. Aaron and Hur support Moses to pray with persistence and eventually Joshua wins the war with Amalek. Hence Moses' prayer plays a key role in giving the Israelites their victory.

St. Paul through his letter instructs Timothy that all Scripture is inspired by God and to be used profitably for teaching, reproof, for correction and for training. He urges Timothy to preach the Word of God in season and out of season and to be zealous in preaching the message of Jesus persistently.

Through today's Gospel, Jesus explains to His disciples the need to be persevering in our prayers. The poor widow approaches the Judge on several occasions for justice against her adversary. The Judge refused to listen to her and to do anything about her complaints. But due to her persistence, the Judge finally decides to give her justice. Using this parable, Jesus teaches His disciples and us that we are not to lose heart when we pray to God and do not receive what we ask for. We have to be persistent in our plea to God. He assures us that God will certainly give justice to His elect who cry to Him day and night. We should try to end all our prayers with the perfect prayer: 'Thy will be done.' Let us continue to pray but leave the result to God. "Prayer is the oil that keeps the lamp of faith burning brightly." - St. Mother Teresa of Calcutta.

First Reading Exodus 17:8-13

A reading from the book of Exodus

As long as Moses kept his arms raised, Israel had the advantage.

The Amalekites came and attacked Israel at Rephidim. Moses said to Joshua, 'Pick out men for yourself, and tomorrow morning march out to engage Amalek. I, meanwhile will stand on the hilltop, the staff of God in my hand.' Joshua did as Moses told him and marched out to engage Amalek, while Moses and Aaron and Hur went up to the top of the hill. As long as Moses kept his arms raised, Israel had the advantage; when he let his arms fall, the advantage went to Amalek. But Moses' arms grew heavy, so they took a stone and put it under him and on this he sat, Aaron and Hur supporting his arms, one on one side, one on the other; and his arms remained firm until sunset. 


