Second Sunday of Lent Year A 8th March 2020



Today's Gospel describes in detail the transfiguration of Jesus on Mount Tabor. During the transfiguration experience the disciples were overshadowed by a cloud and a voice from heaven proclaimed, "This is my Son, my chosen, listen to Him". At the transfiguration the whole Trinity was present: The Father in voice, the Son in the man Jesus and the Holy Spirit in the bright cloud.

The transfiguration experience strengthened the disciples and opened their eyes and it gave them glimpse of God's abiding presence in Jesus. The key to the transfiguration experience and the revelations is in prayer - to be in union with the heavenly Father. It is in those periods of deep prayer that we are most likely to witness and experience the glory of God. Lent is a chosen time to have a glimpse of the transfigured Jesus. That experience has to begin from within us with the power of God's grace.

Lent is a time to put our souls before a mirror and see ourselves as we really are. Lent is not so much about doing something extra for God, as it is about letting God do something extra for us. Let's have a new way of looking at Lent and Fasting:



However, Holy Water is to be temporarily removed from stoups at the doors of the churches to reduce the possibility of transmission of the virus. Holy Water will continue to be available for people to take home, by bringing their own container, to collect holy water, and seeing either Fr Tomy or Fr Baby.

We will make hand sanitiser available at the church entrances as soon as it becomes available in the shops.

If you choose the option for the Sign of Peace, individuals should avoid shaking hands but say "Peace be with you" and offer a smile, wave, nod or bow.

Holy Communion will not be distributed from the Chalice until further notice. The Faithful are reminded that Christ is fully present under either species.

For those who receive Communion on the tongue, this option is still available, at the moment, until the situation is reviewed.

For those Ministers who take communion to the sick, in hospitals, aged care facilities, or people's homes, they should also follow the advice of local health authorities.

For those too unwell to attend Sunday Mass - or are at particular risk of contracting the COVID-19 virus, can honour their Sunday obligation by participating in a time of prayer within the home, reading the Scriptures or watching Mass on television or online (http://bit.ly/MassOnDemand).
