

The Humble Shall be Exalted



Today's Gospel reading narrates the parable of the Pharisee and the Tax collector: both went to the temple to pray. The Pharisee who was conscious of his own righteousness went beyond the requirements of the law and thinks that he is better placed than all others. On the other hand, the Tax collector remains at a distance, casting his eyes down and beating his breast - acknowledging his own sinfulness and unworthiness. Jesus praised the Tax collector for his honesty and humility and said, this man went home justified. But the Pharisee was condemned, because of his self-righteousness and pride.

In the eyes of Jesus, values of the world are set upside down. The Tax collector's prayer 'pierced the clouds' whereas the Pharisee's prayer reached its destination - himself. Today Jesus is inviting us to look into own hearts and see whether our attitudes and our prayers are of self-righteousness like that of the Pharisee or like that of the Tax collector, acknowledging our failures and humble acceptance of our unworthiness. "Humility is the mother of all virtues" - St. Mother Teresa of Calcutta.

"Do you wish to rise? Begin by descending. You plan a tower that will pierce the clouds? Lay first the foundations of humility" - St. Augustine.


