In today's Gospel, we have a graphic description of Jesus' encounter with Zacchaeus the chief tax collector of Jericho and the wonderful way Zacchaeus responded to the invitation of Jesus. That day in Jericho, there were large crowds. On inquiry, Zacchaeus found that Jesus the miracle worker was passing by. He desired to see Jesus just once. Since he was a short man, he climbed a sycamore tree on the roadside and sat on one of its branches. Jesus along with his disciples came that way.

Then the most unexpected and amazing thing happened in the life of this little rich man. Jesus looked up and said, "Zacchaeus, come down, for I must stay at your house today". Zacchaeus was certainly thrilled and confused. So, he came down from the tree and took Jesus to his house. Till that day, Zacchaeus wanted only money and more of it. But that chance encounter with the Lord, changed everything in his life. He knew very well that, riches he amassed were done dishonestly. So, he gave half of what he owned to the poor and declared that he would repay in four-fold anyone he cheated. Jesus' presence totally and irrevocably changed this man. No wonder Jesus said " today, salvation has come to this house" Today, Jesus is passing by and inviting each one of us also to come down from the tree of our selfishness and unfaithfulness.
