
A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke Lk 21:5-19

When some were talking about the Temple, remarking how it was adorned with fine stonework and votive offerings, Jesus said, 'All these things you are staring at now - the time will come when not a single stone will be left on another: everything will be destroyed.' And they put to him this question: 'Master,' they said 'when will this happen, then, and what sign will there be that this is about to take place?'

'Take care not to be deceived,' he said 'because many will come using my name and saying, "I am he" and, "The time is near at hand." Refuse to join them. And when you hear of wars and revolutions, do not be frightened, for this is something that must happen but the end is not so soon.' In Luke's Gospel today, we seem to get the impression that Jesus' teaching in Jerusalem, is coming to an end, just before the events that will lead to his crucifixion. His warnings and predictions give the impression that something bad is going to happen, but, of course, they can be read in many different ways.

For those who first heard Luke's Gospel, his words may have been encouragement. The destruction of the Temple in Jerusalem by the Romans (70A.D.) was history. Catholic Biblical Scholars, suggest Luke's Gospel was written somewhere between 80 and 90 A.D. And so, his listeners were probably Gentile Christians. Luke is trying to interpret the fall of Jerusalem for them and to locate it in God's plans for humankind. At the same time, he's suggesting to them that there will be a considerable time to wait before Jesus' final coming. Those who have been listening to Luke have probably seen a lot of upheaval in their lifetime and are anxious to know if these are the signs of Jesus' coming, but Luke is urging greater patience.

In the second part of today's Gospel, Jesus warns that his followers will face persecution for their beliefs. Luke presents persecution as an opportunity for the followers of Jesus for "It will lead to you giving testimony" (Luke 21:13). In persecution, God's wisdom and power will be shown in the example of Jesus' followers but their perseverance, in the face of persecution, will lead to their salvation.

Jesus is assuring all of his followers, including each and everyone of us, who are striving to live out our discipleship, to the best of our ability, that God is present to us, even in times of trouble. And, Jesus will ultimately witness to this with his own death.

As disciples of Jesus, we try to follow his example, trusting in God's unconditional love, mercy and protection, even as we face our own difficulties in life.
