Fifth Sunday of Lent Year C

3rd April 2022



Today's readings remind us that we should not be self-righteous and condemn the lives of others when God is calling them tenderly to conversion. In the Gospel today we have the real-life story of a woman caught in the act of adultery. Some people brought this unfortunate woman to Jesus. Practically everyone present at the scene wanted her to be condemned and stoned to death according to the Mosaic law. But Jesus showed mercy and forgiveness to her and gave her a new life. Forgiveness was granted to her by Jesus not because what she did was not against the commandment of God but because He loved her in spite of her sinful life. She was forgiven and was told by Jesus to go in peace and from now on she should not be enslaved by sin. Hence Jesus dispenses the generosity of God's forgiveness.

The woman's sin which the law condemned and others wanted to kill her is totally and dramatically forgiven by Jesus. Today Jesus tells not only to the sinful woman but to each one of us to go in peace and not to sin again. Jesus shows us that the greatest law is the law of love and every other law should be complementary to it. During this Lent let us too respond to the forgiving love of God positively and decisively. Let us learn to acknowledge our sins, ask God's forgiveness every day and extend the same forgiveness to our erring brothers and sisters. We need to learn to hate the sin but love the sinners, showing them Jesus' compassion and working with the Holy Spirit to make our own lives exemplary so that we can help lead them to Jesus' ways. My dear friends, let us approach upcoming Holy Week with a desire to nourish our lives so that we may rise above our sins to meet the risen Christ. Let the power of God's mercy and forgiveness make us a people of faith and friendship.

everything as so much rubbish if only I can have Christ and be given a place in him. I am no longer trying for perfection by my own efforts, the perfection that comes from the Law, but I want only the perfection that comes through faith in Christ, and is from God and based on faith. That is the way I can hope to take my place in the resurrection of the dead.
