The Church, as explained by the Second Vatican Council, is by her very nature missionary, since according to the plan of the Father, she has her origin in the mission of the Son and the Holy Spirit. This is the grace and vocation proper to the Church, her deepest identity. She exists in order to evangelize and never be closed in on herself.

The Gospel of today tells us that Jesus summoned his seventy committed people and sent them two by two to communicate God's love, to bind up wounds, and to be peacemakers in a troubled world. Jesus calls each to be ready for the mission, to leave behind the luggage, and set out with hearts fully attuned to his call. They are not to look for comfortable places to stay. They are to be content with whatever is available and provided by the people. Hence single minded devotion to the entrusted task is the hall mark of His disciples. Jesus sends each one of us with the command 'Be on your way. Go into your neighborhoods, schools and offices, proclaim my peace, heal in my name and make my presence felt wherever you are'. It is up to us to respond to the call of the Lord.

One word that occurs and is repeated in all three readings today is "peace". Peace is not merely the absence of war or maintaining a balance of power between adversaries. It is the tranquility of order, it is the effect of justice and it is the effect of charity. Isaiah, in the First Reading, speaks of God sending "flowing peace, like a river". Paul speaks of the peace and mercy that come to all who become that transformed person in Jesus Christ. In the Gospel, Jesus sends his disciples as lambs in the midst of wolves and tells them to proclaim peace and to bring peace with them to every house they enter. This peace is not dependent on outside circumstances. It can exist even when we are surrounded by storms. It is the peace Jesus experienced on the cross in the midst of sufferings.

"Preach the Gospel every day. If necessary use words" - St. Francis of Assisi.
