John is confused because his image of the 'one to come' is an image of a strict judge who would bring a fiery judgement, someone who would dispense such wrath and from whom people would have to flee. But, when John hears what Jesus is doing; healing the sick, blessing the gentle and the peacemakers, telling people they must not judge one another but rather love their enemies; and he doesn't require his disciples to fast, unlike John's disciples. It's no wonder John the Baptist is confused, because if Jesus is the Messiah, it seems he is a world away from what John imagined the Messiah to be like.

When John's disciples do come to Jesus, he doesn't say to them "of course I am the one". Instead he tells them to pay attention to what is happening; the afflicted are healed, the dead are raised to new life, the good news is preached to the poor. Those who meet Jesus must work out, from what he says and does, as to who he actually is. This is a decision of faith, Jesus can't make that decision for anyone, he can't make it for John the Baptist, and he can't make it for us. We have to make that act of faith ourselves.

And so, when John's disciples return to him in prison, and they tell him what Jesus is saying and doing, does John believe that Jesus is the Christ? Does he continue to doubt? Of course, the Gospel doesn't tell us because the gospel is more interested in Jesus. John's time, Preparing the Way for the Lord, has come to an end because 'the one' for whom he has prepared has come.

The question of John, perhaps, may be our question too. Is Jesus the one for us, or are we waiting for someone else? Do we find in Jesus the true answer? May we pray, during this Advent Season, for the answers to our questions.

#### John the Baptist - The Voice That Questions



In the Gospels of Mark and Luke, there is no suggestion that John the Baptist recognised Jesus as the Messiah. But In Matthew's version of Jesus baptism, John, actually recognises Jesus; but Matthew also maintains the tradition that John had his doubts about Jesus as we hear John's voice asking the question from prison, if Jesus is in fact the one.

We know that John is not released from prison, but before his death, he sends his own disciples, to find out from Jesus if John's life of preaching and baptising has its fulfilment in Jesus himself.
