Thirty-Second Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year C

6th November 2022



Today's first reading assures us that faith in God dispels all fears in us. We become strong and courageous even to die for Him only to be raised to an everlasting life with Him. The readiness of the seven Jewish brothers to die rather than violate one of God's laws is a source of great inspiration for everyone who has faith in eternal life.

In today's Gospel, we have an interesting conversation between Sadducees and Jesus regarding the resurrection of

the dead. They did not believe in resurrection because for them the consequences of life after death are ridiculous and meaningless. The question was, what would happen to this woman and her seven husbands at resurrection? Jesus simply overlooked their silly question and told them that their understanding of the resurrection is totally absurd. Jesus said to Sadducees, "You are wrong because you know neither the Scripture nor God's power (Mt 22:29)". The Scripture speaks plainly about the resurrection of the dead. It affirms frequently that there is life after death. Job knew about it. He said, "For I know that my Redeemer lives, and that at last he will stand upon the earth; and after my skin has been thus destroyed, then in my flesh I will see God (19: 25-26)". Prophet Ezekiel foresaw it when he had he vision of the dry bones (cf. ch. 37); and prophet Daniel plainly foretold it, "Many of those who sleep in the dust of the earth shall awake, some to everlasting life, and some to everlasting contempt(12:2)". He told them about Abraham, Isaac, Jacob and Moses, all of them are of great reverence and reputation. These men of God did not die for nothing. God is not a God of the dead but of the living.

During this November, we remember our deceased brothers and sisters and pray for them because we believe that there is life after death. "It is the same too with resurrection of the dead. What is sown is perishable, but what is raised is imperishable" 1 Cor. 15:42.

The greatest proof Jesus gave for the life after death is His own Resurrection. All who believe in Jesus and confess His Name above every other name shall receive eternal life.

2 Maccabees 7:1-2, 9-14

The king of the world will receive us into life eternal at the resurrection.

There were seven brothers who were arrested with their mother. The king tried to force them to taste pig's flesh, which the Law forbids, by torturing them with whips and scourges. One of them, acting as spokesman for the others, said, 'What are you trying to find out from us? We are prepared to die rather than break the Law of our ancestors.'

With his last breath the second brother exclaimed, 'Inhuman fiend, you may discharge us from this present life, but the King of the world will raise us up, since it is for his laws that we die, to live again for ever.' After him, they amused themselves with the third, who on being asked for his tongue promptly thrust it out and

on being asked for his tongue promptly thrust it out and boldly held out his hands, with these honourable words, 'It was heaven that gave me these limbs; for the sake of his laws I disdain them; from him I hope to receive them again.' The king and his attendants were astounded at the young man's courage and his utter indifference to suffering.

When this one was dead they subjected the fourth to the same savage torture. When he neared his end he cried, 'Ours is the better choice, to meet death at men's hands, yet relying on God's promise that we shall be raised up by him; whereas for you there can be no resurrection, no new life.'

Gospel

Luke 20:27-38

He is not a God of the dead but of the living.

Some Sadducees - those who say that there is no resurrection - approached Jesus and they put this question to him, 'Master, we have it from Moses in writing, that if a man's married brother dies childless, the man must marry the widow to raise up children for his brother. Well, then, there were seven brothers. The first, having married a wife, died childless. The second and then the third married the widow. And the same with all seven, they died leaving no children. Finally the woman herself died. Now, at the resurrection, to which of them will she be wife since she had been married to all seven?' Jesus replied, 'The children of this world take wives and husbands, but those who are judged worthy of a place in the other world and in the resurrection from the dead do not marry because they can no longer die, for they are the same as the angels, and being children of the resurrection they are sons of God. And Moses himself implies that the dead rise again, in the passage about the bush where he calls the Lord the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac and the God of Jacob. Now he is God, not of the dead, but of the living; for to him all men are in fact alive.
