"Father will give you another Counsellor"



Today's Gospel passage is a part of the farewell discourse of Jesus to His disciples. During His discourse, Jesus assures His disciples of His continued presence through the gift of the Holy Spirit. It is the Holy Spirit, indwelling in us who makes us experience Jesus in our lives and helps us to be true followers of the Lord. Only the Holy Spirit can effect transformations in our lives.

The commandments of Jesus are summarised in the commandment of Love which is the expression of a disciple's total way of life. To live this commandment of Love, we need the presence of the Holy Spirit.

Jesus tells His disciples that He will not leave them orphans. He will ask the Father to send them advocate or a lawyer. The original Greek *paracletos* means defending advocate and consoler, a helper, a mediator or it means too as 'to be called upon' for help and assistance. Both meanings describe the role of the Holy Spirit in our lives which is the Spirit of truth.

We become signs of God's presence by strengthening our families and friendships, respecting life, attending to our environment, keeping our bodies healthy, praying for others, consoling the sick and those in need, finding Christ in our sufferings, witnessing Christ in our lives each day, showing compassion and promoting reconciliation.

A gift that means nothing unless it is brought out into real life and lived. It demands not just "talking the talk but walking the walk."

Message from Bishop Anthony

The Archdiocese of Sydney has developed a site to assist parishes throughout Australia as they respond to the easing of restrictions and the introduction of public Masses again. It is

called massregister.com.au.

Bishop Anthony has recommended its use throughout our own Diocese of Broken Bay – though it is for individual parishes to consider its merit and to decide on its implementation.

Massregister.com.au is a site on which we can ask those people who are nominating to attend our parish Masses or who are intending to visit our church to log-in their details. Please note that the site does not allow people to nominate for a particular Mass on a particular day. This would have to be done through other local means, such as through the parish office. However, it is most convenient way by which parishes can be assisted to keep a log of all those who are attending their site.

Dear brothers,

Subsequent to Bishop Anthony's welcome letter to us earlier today in respect to how we can respond to the easing of restrictions occasioned by the pandemic, and in response to some questions you have raised, might I add the following clarifications in regards to the numbers able to be present at any one religious gathering?

For Masses generally: the number is 10 plus the priest. The number 10 includes people such as servers, readers, musicians. It is important that we do not flaunt the regulation of only 10 people inside the church, such that it doubles in number because of all those regarded as 'assistants.'


