Matthew is writing, about the year 80, at the time when the Christian community is facing heavy criticism from the Jewish leaders. Around the year 85 one of the prayers in the synagogues is a formal curse on everyone, especially Jewish Christians. And so, instigated by the Pharisees, Jewish Christians are now expelled from the synagogues, and this expulsion increases the hostility of Christians towards them.

Matthew, in writing his Gospel, is anxious to show that Jesus didn't come to abolish the Law and the Prophets, rather he is their completion. Matthew shows the continuity with ancient tradition. But he also shows discontinuity when Jesus says; "You have heard how it was said...but I say this to you" Here Jesus completes the Law but he also goes beyond it, because Jesus is who he is, he is the authority to put before people a new vision.

have improved.

When we look at our own record of doing good against the demands of the gospel, we can often feel helpless because our efforts can look poor against the clear and unambiguous demands of the Gospel.

But Matthew isn't writing his gospel to put us down, or make us feel helpless. He's calling the community of believers, and so calling each of us, to face the vision of Jesus with an open willing heart and spirit.

Of course, we can't do this on our own, we need to be gathered in community to pray to God for the grace to live out his vision, in this neighbourhood of grace, and draw others to him.
