Nineteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year C



Faith and Faithfulness

The first reading from the book of Wisdom gives a message of hope. The author promises that those who put their trust in the Lord God will not be disappointed. The chosen people are encouraged to persevere in their faith.

The second reading recalls the great and unshakable faith of Abraham. Because of his deep faith Abraham is rightly called the father of faith. The faith of Abraham led him to set out without knowing where he was going but he totally trusted in the providence of God and looked forward to a city built by God. Hence in the life of Abraham we have a marvellous and shining example of living faith and total faithfulness to God.

In today's Gospel passage Jesus tells His disciples and us about the heavenly treasure which cannot be stolen or destroyed. In the second part Jesus narrates the parable of the faithful servant who is always found to be watchful whatever may be the time of the master's return. The Master comes unexpectedly at any time of the night. The element of surprise is his weapon. We must be prepared to welcome the Lord whenever He comes. Such a faithful servant will be greatly rewarded by the Master by giving him charge of all the master's possessions. Jesus exhorts us to take our life seriously and do our duties faithfully. Today we are invited to wait for the Lord in our daily lives by learning to see Jesus in the least of our brothers and sisters. In other words, we must be prepared to serve Jesus in whatever form he takes. What we frequently discover in "serving" other people is that God comes to us through them.


