Thirty-Second Sunday in Ordinary Time Year B

7th November 2021



The First reading describes the total self-giving of a poor widow from Zarephath who generously gave food to Prophet Elijah from the little she had. She had very little food at her disposal for her son and herself. Yet at the request of Elijah she cooked what little she had and offered it to him. God rewarded her generosity and she and her household had food till the famine was over.

In today's Gospel passage Jesus gives us a teaching on generosity in action. He was sitting near the temple treasury and watching many people putting money into the treasury. He observed a poor widow came and put two copper coins (which had very little value) into the temple treasury. Jesus praised this poor widow who He says, "has put in everything she had, her whole living".

This is a lesson for all of us that we be generous. It was told by St. Mother Teresa of Calcutta, "Give until it hurts, until you feel the pain". And Jesus Himself said, "Give and it will be given to you. A good measure, pressed down, shaken together, running over will be put into your lap." Hence today's first reading and the Gospel give us powerful messages regarding our generosity to God and to our fellow humans. Generosity does not go unrewarded when it is done out of love and concern. The widow of Zarephath and the widow at Jerusalem temple gave all that they had and became models of generosity. Today Jesus invites us to be generous givers.

Let us, like the poor widow, find the courage to share the wealth and talents we hold. Let us stop dribbling out our stores of love, selflessness, sacrifice, and compassion and dare to pour out our whole heart, our whole being, "whole life" into the Hands and Heart of God and so into the hidden, love-starved coffers of this world.

1 Kings 17:10-16

The widow made a little scone from her flour meal and brought it to Elijah.

Elijah the Prophet went off to Sidon. And when he reached the city gate, there was a widow gathering sticks; addressing her he said, 'Please bring a little water in a vessel for me to drink.' She was setting off to bring it when he called after her. 'Please' he said 'bring me a scrap of bread in your hand.' 'As the Lord your God lives,' she replied 'I have no baked bread, but only a handful of meal in a jar and a little oil in a jug; I am just gathering a stick or two to go and prepare this for myself and my son to eat, and then we shall die.' But Elijah said to her, 'Do not be afraid, go and do as you have said; but first make a little scone of it for me and bring it to me, and then make some for yourself and for your son. Second Reading

Christ offered himself only once to take the faults of many on himself.

It is not as though Christ had entered a man-made sanctuary which was only modelled on the real one; but it was heaven itself, so that he could appear in the actual presence of God on our behalf. And he does not have to offer himself again and again, like the high priest going into the sanctuary year after year with the blood that is not his own, or else he would have had to suffer over and over again since the world began. Instead of that, he has made his appearance once and for all, now at the end of the last age, to do away with sin by sacrificing himself. Since men only die once, and after that comes judgement, so Christ, too, offers himself only once to take the faults of many on himself, and when he appears a second time, it will not be to deal with sin but to reward with salvation those who are waiting for him.
