The EXALTATION OF THE HOLY CROSS YEAR C

14th September, 2025 Our New Saints





At the first canonization Mass of his pontificate, Pope Leo XIV proclaimed Carlo Acutis and Pier Giorgio Frassati saints, praising their devotion to the Eucharist, prayer and serving the poor. The pope urged the faithful, especially young people, to follow their examples and live the great "adventure" of following God's plan.

New young saints encourage faithful to live life to the full, pope emphasised. The pope said the new saints "cultivated their love for God and for their brothers and sisters through simple acts, available to everyone: daily Mass, prayer and especially Eucharistic adoration."

St. Frassati was born April 6, 1901, in Turin and died there July 4, 1925, of polio at the age of 24. St. Pier Giorgio Frassati was a devout Italian Catholic activist, who combined his deep faith, love for mountain climbing, and dedication to serving the poor and sick. Known as the "Man of the Beatitudes," he died of polio at the age of 24 in 1925, but his virtuous life and joyful spirit have inspired young people worldwide. He was beatified by Pope John Paul II in 1990 and was canonized a saint in 2025.

St. Acutis was born to Italian parents May 3, 1991, in London. Acutis was interested in Catholicism from a very young age, however. He loved to pray the rosary and attended daily mass after making his first communion at age seven. The ritual of the Eucharist became his lifelong passion, and he often asked his parents to take him to the birth-places of saints and the sites of eucharistic miracles. Acutis was popularly called "the patron saint of the Internet" once his cause for saint-hood was underway. He died in Monza, Italy, Oct. 12, 2006, of leukemia at the age of 15.

The pope said that "even when illness struck them and cut short their young lives, not even this stopped them nor prevented them from loving, offering themselves to God, blessing him and praying to him for themselves and for everyone."




