## FIFTH SUNDAY OF EASTER YEAR C

Pope Leo XIV.

Habemus papam! (We have a Pope!)

These words echoed over Saint Peter's Square on the even-

ing of Thursday, 8th May in Rome, as Cardinal Dominique Mamberti announced the election of Cardinal Robert Prevost as the new Pope, taking the name Pope Leo XIV.

Upon his election, he became the first North American Pope and the first pope from the Order of Saint Augustine. Born in the United States, he joined the Augustinians and spent most of his priesthood as a missionary priest in Peru, while also studying and teaching in seminaries. He was elected Prior General of the Order of Saint Augustine in 2001, serving two consecutive, six-year terms in the role.

In 2015, he was made Bishop of Chiclayo in Peru in 2014 and elevated to the Cardinalate in 2023. He was the prefect for the Dicastery for Bishops for more than two years prior to his election, giving him a strong degree of visibility within the Church. While his election surprised many, particularly given the fact he has only been a cardinal for less than two years, he brings a strong pedigree of experience as a missionary, administrator and teacher.

Pope Leo XIV has already held a handful of meetings during the first week since his election, but the real work will begin following his Inauguration Mass on Sunday, May 18. The Mass will be the inauguration of the Petrine ministry and is expected to be attended by Bishops and world leaders, including Bishop Anthony Randazzo and Prime Minister Anthony Albanese. Let us be united in faith and continue to pray for our new shepherd Pope Leo XIV.

#### **Learn Veni Creator Spiritus for Pentecost**

As we prepare for Pentecost, why not take a little time to learn Veni Creator Spiritus, the beautiful chant sung by Catholics around the world at this time of year? Our new Holy Father Pope Leo XIV has been deliberate in singing Gregorian chant from our treasury of

sacred music. This ancient hymn, likely written by Rabanus Maurus around 856AD, has been used for centuries at important moments in the life of the Church—from councils and synods to Conclaves and retreats. It even carries a plenary indulgence when sung on Pentecost. We will be singing the hymn at the 9am Mass on Pentecost, below you will find a link to a beautiful recording of the hymn with the translated text, and also a link to a 'podcast' which takes you through learning the hymn line-by-line.



A reading from the Acts of the Apostles

They assembled the church and gave an account of
all that God had done with them.

Paul and Barnabas went back through Lystra and Iconium to Antioch. They put fresh heart into the disciples, encouraging them to persevere in the faith. 'We all have to experience many hardships' they said 'before we enter the kingdom of God.' In each of these churches they appointed elders, and with prayer and fasting they commended them to the Lord in whom they had come to believe.

They passed through Pisidia and reached Pamphylia. Then after proclaiming the word at Perga they went down to Attalia and from there sailed for Antioch, where they had originally been commended to the grace of God for the work they had now completed.
