Fifth Sunday of Easter, Year A

7th May, 2023



Today's Gospel is a scene from the Last Supper .This is the most beautiful, or one of the most beautiful, parts of the Gospel. Scripture tells us that Jesus did two things that night which define the sacramental nature of "service": He commissioned his disciples to bring His healing power of forgiveness, allowing us to reconcile ourselves with one another and with God; and He showed, by example, what it means to be compassionate and to minister to one another.

Jesus says to those around that first table - and to all those who continue to gather around the table. "Do not let your hearts be troubled". You have to have faith. You have to have faith in God, you must trust in God and you must love God. And you must have faith in me and trust me, for I and the Father are one.

In answer to Thomas' question Jesus said and continues to say to us, those three immortal words, "I am the way, I am the truth and I am the life. I am the way. Just follow me, be with me, come with me, walk with me, love with me, care with me, and forgive with me. His claim to be "the way" is foreshadowed in the parable of the door or the gate: "I am the gate of the sheepfold". "And this is the truth: that God has taken you to Himself and made you one with Him, and together we are to walk through the world with faith in each other and love for each other and forgiveness for each other. He is the life that is the light of all people (John 1:4). As the Gospel unfolds, we learn that he is the bread of life, even the resurrection and the life.

From time immemorial men have been in search of the eternal way, but they found none; from time immemorial, men have been in search of the eternal truth, but they never discovered it; from time immemorial, men have been in search of the eternal life, but they never attained it. In Jesus that search for the eternal way, truth ad life comes to an end. And this is what it means: to know Jesus is to love him, to walk with Him and to share His life.

it is pardoning that we are pardoned and it in dying that we are born to Eternal life.


St Mary's Primary School Toukley 50th Anniversary!!

First Reading Acts 6:1-7 A reading from the Acts of the Apostles

They elected seven men filled with the Spirit and wisdom.

About this time, when the number of disciples was increasing, the Hellenists made a complaint against the Hebrews: in the daily distribution their own widows were being overlooked. So the Twelve called a full meeting of the disciples and addressed them, 'It would not be right for us to neglect the word of God so as to give out food; you, brothers, must select from among yourselves seven men of good reputation, filled with the Spirit and with wisdom; we will hand over this duty to them, and continue to devote ourselves to prayer and to the service of the word.' The whole assembly approved of this proposal and elected Stephen, a man full of faith and of the Holy Spirit, together with Philip, Prochorus, Nicanor, Timon, Parmenas, and Nicolaus of Antioch, a convert to Judaism. They presented these to the apostles, who prayed and laid their hands on them. The word of the Lord continued to spread: the number of disciples in Jerusalem was greatly increased, and a large group of priests made their submission

That means that for you who are believers, it is precious; but for unbelievers, the stone rejected by the builders has proved to be the keystone, a stone to stumble over, a rock to bring men down. They stumble over it because they do not believe in the word; it was the fate in store for them. But you are a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a consecrated nation, a peo-

ple set apart to sing the praises of God who called you out of the darkness into his wonderful light.

whoever believes in me will perform the same works as I do myself, he will perform even greater works, because I am going to the Father.'
